The annual report of the United States treasurer gives the aggregate income from all sources as \$1,211,394,-097 and the outgo as \$1,122,647,665. Deposits in national banks aggregate \$147,842,610, and the treasury holds \$631,420,789 in gold. There is a working balance of over \$86,000,000. The supply of new currency has scarcely kept pace with the demand, and congress is asked to authorize the issue of gold certificates for \$10 and remove the restriction on the issue of five dollar notes by national banks.
