
Would Have Forced Colombia.

cial reception to Mr. Bunau-Varilla, minister of the newborn American protected republic of Panama, Nov. 13, while congress and the public speculated, with differing views, on the consequences politically and commercially.

From the impressive words exchanged by President Roosevelt and the minister it is clear that the main consequence of this action, by which Panama's government came under the protecting arm of international law and comity, was believed by them and by all administration adherents to be the virtual realization of the centuries old dream of a direct waterway from Europe to the orient.

During the first week of the ertra session it became evident, however, that the Democratic minority in congress was solidifying in opposition to this purpose and was getting in line to press anew the claims of the Nicaragua route. The administration's supporters contend that the treaty with Colombia, approved by congress, gives ample authority for going shead to make terms with Panama.

Aside from this matter of canal route the larger political question of extending the American sphere of influence and protection is involved.
