Tibetan Battle a Disgrace.

The Liberal leaders in England have treated the slaughter of 400 Tibetans at Guru last week as one of the worst blots on the history of England.

Bomb For King Alfonso.

While King Alfonso of Spain was leaving the Labor exposition at Barcelona, April 7, his life was endangered by the explosion of a bomb.

Jew Baiting in Bulgaria.

Reports of a violent outbreak against the Jews at Lompalankay in Bulgaria were confirmed by official advices to Berlin.

When the Cuban congress was convened, April 4, the house was unable to muster a quorum, as the Nationalists refused to enter for fear of being outvoted by the Republicans and Liberals.

Coal Trust Must Tell All.

That a corporation, no matter how big, must reveal its secret contracts on demand of the interstate commerce commission is the opinion of the United States supreme court.

Harriman Sues Merger.

Has the big fight for Northern Pacific been resumed? Either to protect themselves or to determine the legality of the proposed plan of the pro rata distribution of Northern Securities stock the Union Pacific interests, headed by E. H. Harriman and W. S. Pierce, have brought action in the United States circuit court at St. Paul for an order directing the trust to return to the original shareholders the Northern Pacific stock exchanged for Northern Securities.

Sentences on Burton.

Judge Elmer B. Adams in the United States court at St. Louis, April 6, sentenced Senator Burton of Kansas to serve six months in jail and pay a fine of \$2,500 for having used his official position for private gain.

Notes.

The reading public, especially in the east, has followed with unusual inter-

est the efforts of the Massachusetts police authorities to penetrate the mystery surrounding the death of Mabel Page, a young woman of a wealthy family at Weston, near Boston, March 31.

Executive.

Battleship Virginia Launched.

The state of Virginia had a legal holiday April 5 in honor of the launching of the great 15,000 ton battleship named for the state, which occurred at Newport News, Va., in the presence of 50,000 spectators.

The Alabama's Thirteen-inch Record.

Unofficial advices were received from the naval squadron at Pensacola, Fla., to the effect that the battleship Alabama had already beaten the new record won by the Kearsarge gunners.

Our Population Last Year.

Now that we have a permanent census bureau we are luxuriating in the more frequent count of American noses. A bulletin issued April 7 estimates the population of the United States, exclusive of Alaska and the colonies, at 79,900,389, or an increase of nearly 4,000,000 since 1900.

Legislative.

Swayne Case Postponed.

The Republican leaders in congress who are in favor of an early adjournment have avoided the delay attending the impeachment of Judge Swayne by fixing Dec. 13 next as the day when the house will consider the impeachment charges.

Pay of Rural Mail Carriers.

The senate agreed to the amendment fixing the salary of rural mail carriers at \$720 a year. A proviso was added permitting the carriers to handle merchandise, take subscriptions for and deliver newspapers and periodicals.

Eight Hour Bill Referred.

The house committee on labor has decided that the eight hour bill should be referred to Secretary of Commerce and Labor Cortelyou, with a request to furnish answers to a variety of questions, such as the additional cost to government contracts involved in the shorter day, the damage to manufacturing interests, to export trade and whether the labor people are willing to give up the right to work more than eight hours.

General.

To Set the Republican Pace.

The latest responsible report of the administration's plans has it that former Secretary of War Root is to be temporary chairman of the Republican national convention at Chicago, July 21, making the keynote speech, and that Speaker Cannon shall be made

the permanent chairman to keep the convention in order. Governor Murphy of New Jersey is now talked of as chairman of the national committee.

Chicago Favors Ownership.

The only point of general interest about the municipal election at Chicago, Wednesday, was the overwhelming majority in favor of municipal ownership of the street railways.

New York's Gambler Act.

Three important laws have been enacted by the legislature of New York in the past week, all of which create precedents. One was the anti-gambling bill advocated by District Attorney Jerome, the avowed object of which was to compel the testimony of Reginald Vanderbilt in order to convict Richard Canfield, the millionaire proprietor of gambling houses.

A bill was passed providing pensions for judges of the court of appeals and justices of the supreme court. The opponents openly charged that the judges had used their influence to secure this legislation.

Both houses favored the abolition of the office of coroner in New York city.

Iowa Woman Suffrage Vote.

By a vote of 40 to 30 the lower house of the Iowa legislature went on record April 4 in favor of woman suffrage. It was predicted by some that the bill would be killed in the senate.

Kansas Democrats Divided.

Avoiding the horn of either dilemma as to presidential preferences the Kansas state convention, April 7, followed its usual custom of sending an unstructured delegation to the national convention. Reports differ as to the personnel of the delegation, Hearst claiming a majority and the conservative faction denying it.

EDUCATIONAL

Educational Play Acting.

Mrs. Emmons Blaine, Chicago's educational philanthropist, who has given \$1,000,000 to the school of education in Chicago university, advocates in the April Elementary School Teacher the use of dramatic acting as an everyday school means in the teaching of history, literature, ethics, etc.



Mrs. Emmons Blaine, Blaine says that the dramatic instinct is strong in children, and with training it may help powerfully to construct stronger and better grown-ups, with clearer and finer minds.

Geography and News.

No matter what the regular graded course, calls for, says the Journal of Education, this is the one time in your life and in the life of the children in which to teach the geography of Russia, Korea, Manchuria and Japan.

Russia Invites the Japanese Advance

"Walk into my (Manchurian) parlor," said the (Russian) spider to the (Japanese) fly. And the fly appears to be going in better skelter as the spider withdraws into its inland stronghold.

This is about the status of the great conflict in eastern Asia after two months of sparring. When the advance guard of the Japanese army in northwestern Korea reached Wiju, the principal city on the Korean side of the Yalu estuary, April 4, they found, to their surprise, that the Russian forces had vanished, presumably having retreated across the river to entrench themselves in stronger force.

Admiral Togo's fleet again concentrated at Port Arthur April 9, and some decisive work was looked for. The Russian ships during the week were seen by press boats on the high seas, thus proving that Port Arthur was still uncracked.

The attitude of the Chinese continues to cause alarm, as their hostility to Russia is intensified by the reported excesses of the Russian soldiery.
