

R. Hearst was approved and the Kansas City platform was indorsed.

The Washington state convention at Olympia May 5 sent a Hearst delegation to St. Louis under the unit rule, but not definitely instructed.

The Democratic faction in Chicago headed by Mayor Harrison suffered a partial eclipse May 3, when the Hearst faction secured a majority of the delegation to the state convention.

The Walker Democratic Tip.

Editor John Brisben Walker of the litan, who has been identified with the Bryan wing of the Democracy, made an address in Cooper Union, New York, last week, outlining a Democratic platform which, he said, has been approved by the leaders of the opposing factions. It consists of six planks, leading off with one on finance to retire bonds and legal tenders and replace the same by thirty year 2 per cent bonds convertible at will into legal tender and the amount to be increased as population increases. The trust plank favors a national corporation law obliging corporations to tell the government all about their business. Other planks are a gradual diminution of the tariff, parcels post. Notes. gradual independence of the Philippines and good roads. Mr. Walker declared that Bryan would not bolt such praised Hearst and criticised Parker.


