YARNELL.

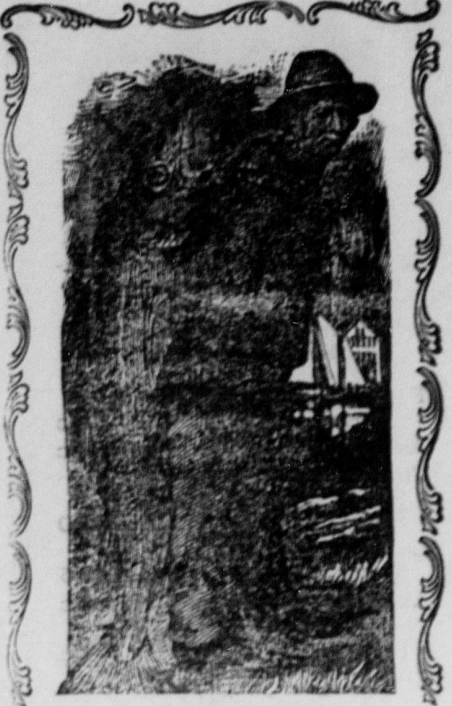
Pastor A. C. Lathrop preached a very able sermon at the Baptist chapel Sunday p. m. and pastor Bingham at the U. B. church the same evening.
