FOURTEEN years ago the democrats won a more decisive victory in the Congressional elections than the republicans won on November 8. A month after the McKinley tariff was enacted the country elected to Congress 236 democrats and only 88 republicans. This gave the former a majority of 148, compared with the majority of 116 which the republicans will have in the House, though the latter contains 54 more members than the one chosen in 1890. Of the membership of the House just elected the republicans have 65 and the democrats 35 per cent., but in the House elected fourteen years ago the democrats had more than 71 per cent., and there were a few Populists.
