



### P. R. R.'s New Bond Issue.

At the annual meeting of the board of directors of the Pennsylvania Railroad company March 14 a new bond issue of \$50,000,000 was authorized by the shareholders of the company. This issue will be added to the \$50,000,000 bond issue of March, 1903, which has not been put out. This makes the total \$100,000,000, and it is expected that the bonds will bear 31/2 per cent interest and will be convertible at 150 into common stock.

# Adams Unseated as Governor of Colorado

Colorado's disturbing governorship contest ended in a sort of compromise between those for seating Peabody and those for retaining Adams. The supreme court had ruled that the assembly must name either one or the other.

Finally a deal was made with the Wolcott Republicans that if they would support Peabody he would resign after one day in office, thus making Lieutenant Governor Jesse F. McDonald, Republican, the governor. This programme was carried out when, March 16, the joint assembly voted, 51 to 41, in favor of Peabody. On the same day Governor De Facto Adams surrendered his office to Peabody. Adams had served since his inauguration Jan. 10, the canvass of returns having shown a plurality of 9,774. Two days later Mr. Peabody filed a contest for the office which he had surrendered, and the assembly authorized a committee to hear evidence and report conclusions. By rejecting votes on the ground of fraud fourteen Republican members of the committee gave a majority of 2,280 votes for Peabody.

Governor Peabody's resignation was sent to the secretary of state March 17, and the lieutenant governor was sworn in as governor. Mc-Donald is a mine owner, serving his third term as mayor of Leadville. Ex-Governor Adams says he has been deeply wronged.




