To Cut Down Cotton Acreage. The governors of Louisiana and Mississippi have joined in the effort of the Cotton Growers' association to reduce the acreage of cotton in their states. Both governors have given orders directing the board of control of the penitentiary to reduce the acreage in cotton on the state farms.

Two 10,000 Ton Lake Boats. Two 10,000 ton steel freight boats, the largest for service in the great lakes, were launched on the Detroit river at Detroit, Mich., March 25. They were christened the Amasa Stone and the James E. Davidson, the former being 545 feet long and the latter 524 feet.

The New Baltimore. A survey of the improvements in the burned district of Baltimore has just been completed. It shows that 287 new buildings are now occupied, and it is estimated that more than 1,000 firms and individuals are doing business in the district. The new structures include fifty-six five-story, twenty-five six-story, seven seven-story, one twelve-story and two sixteen-story buildings.

Success of Farmers' Exchange. The Eastern Shore Produce Exchange, an organization of 2,500 Maryland farmers, has declared a 10 per cent dividend on its stock. The purpose of the exchange is to give the farmers up to date information and to market their products at the highest rate by means of systematic co-operation.

RELIGIOUS

Liberty For Russian Catholics. The Roman Catholic bishops of Russia by permission of the czar have formulated a plan to insure the religious liberty of Catholics in the Russian empire, and Archbishop Shenbuck, the Catholic primate, is to take the plan to Rome for the pope's approval. The good will of the Vatican during the Russian crisis is thought to have had something to do with this outcome.

London's Great Revival. The big revival meeting held by the American evangelists, Torrey and Alexander, in Albert Hall closed March 20. Mr. Torrey estimated that 5,500 persons of all classes and creeds had announced their conversion publicly, while thousands of others had done so privately. Several bishops of the Church of England and many Roman Catholic priests attended the meetings. The revivalists will next begin in another part of the city and continue until June, after which they will go to Germany.

EDUCATIONAL

Carnegie to Die Rich.

In an address to the alumni of Stevens Institute at New York last week Andrew Carnegie said that he was going out of "the library business," as his secretary informed him that the applications were only one a day now, and he was inclined to add the smaller colleges, believing that a young man has a better chance of getting an education in them than in the larger universities, where "sport seems generally to be taking the place of valuable education."

In explaining to a reporter this transfer of his beneficence Mr. Carnegie denied that he ever said that "to die rich is to die disgraced." On the contrary, he did not expect to impoverish himself by his public benefactions, but did hope to set in motion systems of wide and practical benevolence in which the fortune he leaves will be profitably and wisely employed by those who come after him. "It is not what I am able to give," said he, "but what I am able to induce others to give, which does the real good which I seek to accomplish." He distinctly objects to the term philanthropist as being applied to himself and says he has always understood this to mean "a man with more money than brains."

To Shorten the School Day. The New York city board of education has voted 22 to 12 in favor of reducing the hours of first year pupils from five to three and a half daily and abolishing the so called fads and frills advocated by Superintendent Maxwell, such as sewing, physical training, games, physiology, hygiene and drawing. In order to be effective, however, this plan must receive the approval of the board of superintendents. Superintendent Maxwell said that the work of the schools was too important to be crippled by the plea of a false economy and that the aim should be to produce "all round men and women whose minds work logically, whose lips speak truly, whose eyes see accurately, whose hands execute with skill and whose hearts are filled with love for their fellow creatures."

The Harvard-Tech Merger.

The agreement under which Harvard university and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology are to co-operate reciprocally provides that a joint school of industrial science, to be known as the Institute of Technology, shall take the place of the present Lawrence Scientific school. The governing board of this school will have three Harvard men. It will occupy a site on the Cambridge side of the Charles river.

Miscellaneous

Accidents. By an explosion in a mill of the Schaghticoke Powder company at Schaghticoke, N. Y., March 28, four men were killed. While maneuvering off Toulon, France, March 27, the French torpedo boat No. 250 struck a rock and was totally wrecked. Fire destroyed sixty buildings at Carbon, Ind., March 25; loss, \$200,000. A landslide at Semlin, Hungary, March 23, killed eight and injured nineteen soldiers of a rescuing party. Four persons were drowned by the capsizing of a rowboat during a squall at Rockledge, Fla., March 23. One of the queerest accidents on record happened to William Creegan, a laborer in the new East river tunnel at New York, one day last week. He was trying to stop a leak in the compartment where the excavation was protected by compressed air when the air, escaping with tremendous force, carried his body upward through the muddy bed of the river and spouted him out on a geyser thirty feet above the water. When he fell back into the water he was able to swim and was picked up by a boat from the shore. Excepting for weakness from loss of breath he was uninjured and returned to work the next day.

Deaths. Maurice Barrymore, the noted actor, at Amityville, N. Y., March 25, aged fifty-eight. Adrian Iselin, the banker and noted benefactor, at New York, March 28, aged eighty-six.
