Democratic Primary Election and Convention.

The Democratic voters of Centre County will meet at the regular places for holding the general elections in their respective election districts, on Saturday, June 2nd, 1906, to elect delegates to the County Convention. Under the rules of the party, the officers for holding the primaries will consist of the Committee and two assistants in each district, and the election will be opened at 3 o'clock p. m., and close at 7 o'clock p. m.

The delegates chosen at the above stated time will meet in the Court House in Bellefonte, on Tuesday, June 5th 1906, at 12 o'clock noon, and nominate the following:

- One candidate for Congress. One candidate for Assembly. One candidate for Jury Commissioner. Three Congressional Conference. Three Senatorial Conference.

A chairman of the County Committee to serve from the 1st day of January, 1907, to the 1st day of January, 1908, and transact such other business as may come before the Convention.

THE Democratic State Convention will meet in the Opera House, at Harrisburg, Wednesday, June 27, 1906, at 12 o'clock noon. The business to be transacted will be the nomination of one candidate for Governor, one candidate for Lieutenant Governor, one candidate for Auditor General, one candidate for Secretary of Internal Affairs, and to act upon such other matters, pertaining to the interest and success of the party in Pennsylvania, as may be brought before it. Centre county has a representation of four delegates in the Convention.

EQUAL DISTRIBUTION.

State Treasurer Berry has sent a circular letter to all applicants for State deposits, stating that there will be no changes until June 1, when the new law goes into effect. Mr. Berry explains the new law at length and the conditions under which the State money will be deposited, how much each bank can get, the rate of interest, etc.

Mr. Berry's remark recently that he had stumbled upon some things in the State Treasury that will make mighty interesting reading when made public has piqued the curiosity of the reform element and they are waiting anxiously for him to lift the lid and show what he has discovered.

AFTER ANOTHER TRUST.

Here is a trust that has been specially feeding upon farmers. The grand jury of the United States Circuit Court in Nashville, Tenn., which has been investigating the alleged fertilizer trust, for the past four weeks, on Saturday returned an indictment against about eight fertilizer manufacturers.

The defendants live in various parts of the country where fertilizers are manufactured and certified copies of the indictment will be sent to the various districts in which the defendants reside and there served. The defendants will be required to execute bonds for their appearance at the October term of the Court in Nashville, when the cases are to be tried.

CALL THE ROLL.

United States Senator Joseph R. Burton, of Kansas, has but one chance left before the sentence of the Circuit Court for the Eastern District of Missouri is carried out, which is that he shall serve nine months in jail, pay a fine of \$500 and be deprived of the right hereafter to hold office under the Government.

The Supreme Court on Monday affirmed the decision of the Circuit Court that Burton had been guilty of violating the law which prohibits Senators and Representatives receiving compensation for services rendered before any of the Government departments in any matter in which the Government may be interested.

United States Senator Mitchell, of Oregon, met the same fate as Burton. Both are republicans. Call the roll for more—the number is legion.

A Few days ago State Treasurer Berry when asked by newspaper men whether or not he will decline or accept the nomination for Governor on the Prohibition ticket, he declined to make a positive statement.
