A Harmless Solution That Will Lighten Laundry Labor.

It is never necessary for harmful washing solutions to be used in order to facilitate the laundering of clothes, of grated onlon, a saltspoonful of salt for there are several things that can and the yolks of two eggs. Stir them be added to the water which will quickly eradicate dirt, besides making truffles and two mushrooms cut in the washing easier, and will not injure the fabric.

Make a very hot soapsuds and add a small portion of the emulsion to the water. Allow the clothes to remain for about five minutes in the water by physicians. and rinse with bot water thoroughly, for in the latter case when the emulsion is used so strong it is quite necessary that every particle should be re-
