

The Two Thomases

Watson, People's Party Nominee For the Presidency, and Hisgen, the Possible Candidate of New Independence Party.

THE People's party has the honor of being first in the field with a presidential candidate in the campaign of 1908, and the head of its ticket is Thomas E. Watson of Georgia. The candidate for vice president is Samuel W. Williams of Indiana. Mr. Watson was nominated for vice president by the People's party in 1896 and for the presidency in 1904. He is politician, journalist, author, lecturer and lawyer. He started out as a poor boy and in spite of the many obstacles in his path succeeded in obtaining an education, in building up a good law practice and in accumulating an independence. He has also made a success in literature and has produced several historical works of importance. He has served in the Georgia legislature and been a member of congress, and it was Watson who introduced the resolution censuring Congressman Cobb of Alabama for intoxication because he had in a rambling speech used the now historic phrase "Where am I at?" Congress refused to censure Judge Cobb, who explained that he had only been drinking tea.

Mr. Watson will be fifty-two years old in September. He is married and has several children and is now quite

that has been asked about the Massachusetts man who has been talked of as the possible candidate of the newly organized Independence party for president of the United States. Briefly answered, Mr. Hisgen is the man who as president of the Four Brothers Independent Oil company had the nerve to defy the Standard Oil trust and who won in this struggle and who later as the nominee of the Independence league for governor of Massachusetts polled the largest vote ever given an independent candidate for that office.

Getting down to details, it may be added that Thomas L. Hisgen was born in Petersburg, Ind., Nov. 26, 1858, and is a son of William Hisgen, a somewhat eccentric German who first located in Albany, N. Y., and then migrated to Indiana, where he carried on a country store. Thomas was the fifth of eleven children, and the care of the family devolved on him to a considerable extent after he was old enough to work, so that his schooling was limited. His father had been experimenting with a formula for the manufacture of axle grease. Thomas and three of his brothers took up the subject and, between them raising a capital of \$500, went into the business of making this product. Fire wiped out the little shack which they equipped as a factory. Undaunted, the four brothers set to work to raise more capital. One sacrificed a diamond pin, and Thomas gave up a violin which he dearly loved. By pawning different objects they raised \$95 and continued business.

About ten years later the Standard Oil company tried to buy them out, offering \$600,000. They refused the offer, but to continue making and selling axle grease in competition with the Standard and found they would have to sell oil too. Thomas L. took charge of the Massachusetts end of the business and in spite of bitter opposition from the monopoly held his own. As nominee of the Democrats and Independence league

for state auditor in 1906 he polled 150,000 votes and as Independence league nominee for governor last year polled 75,000.

Sweet Peas From the Frame.

Here is what a woman did last year with her cold frame that she might have her favorite sweet peas before they possibly could be grown outdoors: She put in the seed early in October, sowing it in rows two feet apart in soil two feet below the glass. By the beginning of winter the plants were five or six inches high, then remained dormant until spring, when they grew slowly.

As the plants and vines began to grow short brush was used to support them until they reached the glass, when the sash was removed and the rows were given tall support.

By the middle of May all the vines had fine blooms on them, which continued until the early planted garden varieties were ready.
