SPRING MILLS.

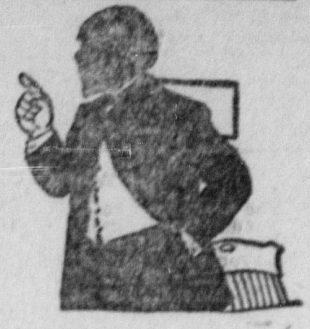
But one more week until June with its roses, is gone. We are having beautiful weather at present.
