

OLD HOME WEEK AT PHILIPSBURG

AN INTERESTING PROGRAM PREPARED FOR ALL A WEEK OF ENTERTAINMENT

Imposing Demonstrations and Monster Parades—Addresses and Display of Relics—Base Ball and Other Interesting Sports.

The following is the official program for Old Home Week celebration at Philipsburg, Pa., Sept. 12 to 19, 1909:

Band concerts will be given every evening in the South Park from 7 to 8 p. m.

The Male Glee Club will render music every evening during the week in the South Park and various parts of the town.

The Old Union Church will be open all the time for visitors and an inspection of old relics and curios of various kinds under the supervision of the ladies of the Historical Committee.

Base ball and other sporting events every afternoon. Dancing at Athletic Park every evening.

Sunday, Sept. 12—Devotional Day: 10:30 a. m. special sermons will be preached by former pastors.

Monday, Sept. 13—Miners' Day: 11:00 a. m. a parade, in which over 600 miners are expected to participate.

Tuesday, Sept. 14—Educational Day: 10:00 a. m. march by scholars of public schools to South Central Park where several addresses will be delivered.

Wednesday, Sept. 15—Phillipsburg Day: 10:00 a. m. addresses by prominent speakers.

Thursday, Sept. 16—Civic and Industrial Parade Day: 10:30 a. m. Base ball and other sporting events.

Friday, Sept. 17—Fireman's Day: 10:30 a. m. a parade of visiting firemen and the local department of Philipsburg.

Saturday, Sept. 18—Commercial Travelers' Day: Automobile Ride 10 a. m. Assembling in South Park 11 a. m. Base ball—DuBois Commercial Travelers vs Altoona Commercial Travelers.

\$50 FOR HORN-TAIL SNAKES

State Zoologist Surface Offers to Buy With His Own Real Money.

Worked up to a pitch as near to anger as he ever gets, and to which he is easily provoked, State Economic Zoologist H. A. Surface offers a reward of \$50, payable out of his own pocket, to any one who will send him a real "horn-tailed snake."

Back of this deft to the non-scientific and superstitious world lies the fact that the horn-tailed snake is a myth, and in the "snake book" issued several years ago Surface says so without mincing words.

The popular belief in the horn-tailed snake is that its tail is tipped with a barbed and very sharp horn.

"Stung" was the answer made by James Snook, an enthusiastic bee keeper of Newtown, Mifflin county, when he came to be in such a terrible plight.

Snook has a large number of hives of honey bees on his place and has been accustomed to work about them for years.

The intense suffering caused Snook to faint. He was discovered by his wife, dragged into the house and physicians called, who pronounced his condition serious.

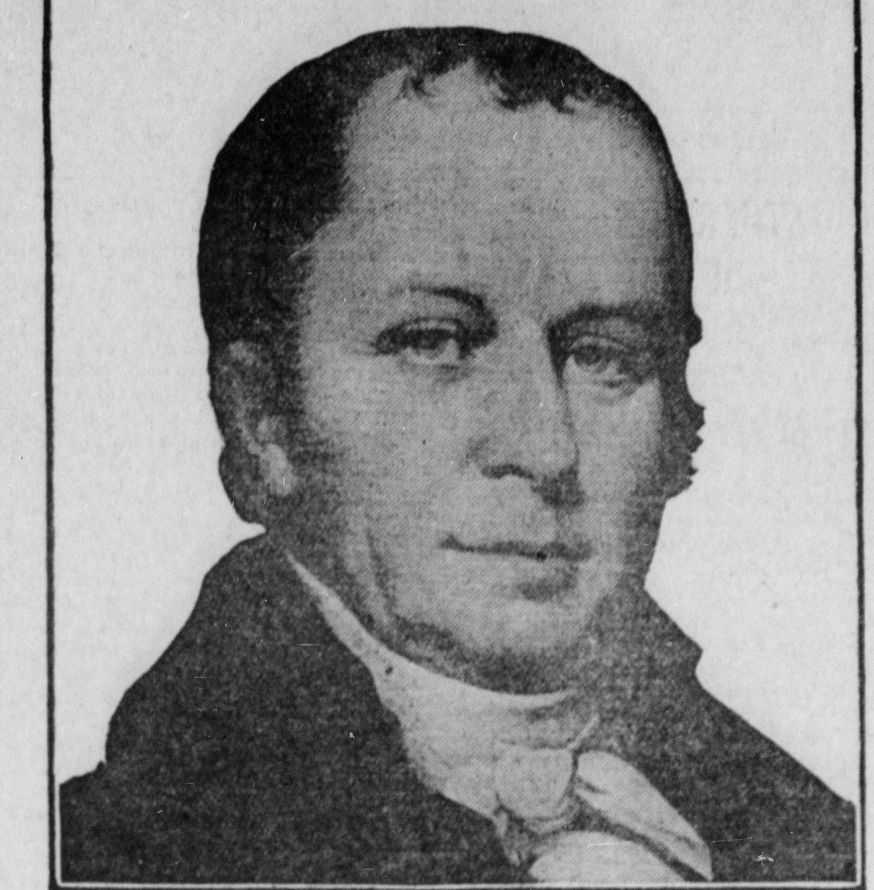
