THE OLD VEST POCKET TICKET.

The election law commission has completed its preliminary work and will begin its tour of the state late in June.

In a formal statement from the commission covering its work it among other things said: "The commission is at present inclined to the belief that a system of separate party ballots issued by the state, but distributed freely in advance of the election, as well as at the polls, and deposited by the voter in the private election box in an official envelope delivered to him at the polls, and of which record is kept, is preferable to the present single sheet blanket ballot delivered and if marked only at the polls."

"This tentative conclusion" was reached in view of the fact that the defeat of the constitution amendments and the abolition of the February election prevent the shortening of the present ballot, which is so large and cumbersome as to confuse the ordinary voter.

"A system by which the voter deposits in secrecy and in an official envelope of the persons for whom he votes would combine much of the simplicity of the old vest pocket ballots, with most of the safe guards of the single sheet ballots. This would also eliminate the necessity for any assistance of the voter in the booth, but would permit him to have all the assistance he desired at home.

"It is further stated that it seems to be conceded that the uniform primary system has not accomplished all that its advocates hoped and that it involves some serious disadvantages and whether it is an improvement depends not only upon its supposed theoretical superiority over other systems, but upon its practical working. The commission desires to have the fullest discussion of this subject, and the most complete information as to the practical operation of it."

The commission also discussed the recommendation of the educational commission that the ballots for school directors should be non-partisan—that is to say, that all the names of all the candidates for school directors, without regard to party, be printed and voted upon, without regard to the particular party nominating the different individuals.

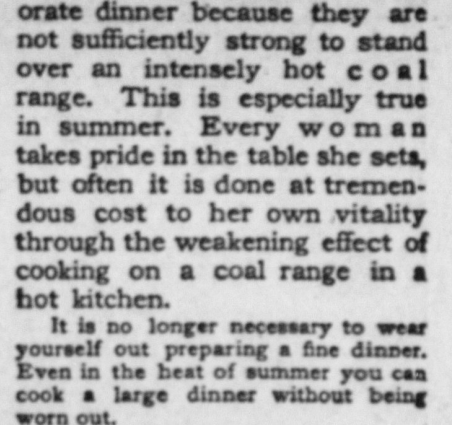
