An Old Ticket. The Lock Haven Express, we think, has the record for old ticket items. This is the latest: John S. Hinkle, draughtsman in the division engineer's office at Renovo, has in his possession four railway tickets on what was known as the Sunbury and Erie railway (later as the Philadelphia and Eric railway). The tickets were issued on the date on which the first passenger train was run between Warren and Erie, and bear the date of August 25, 1860. They call for trips from Erie to Waterford, Erie to Con-cord (now known as Elgin), Erie to Faries (now known as Corry), Warren to Columbus (now known as Colza). Printed on them are the words "Good for one seat," and "The conductor will take up this ticket." When tickets were taken up the conductor was permitted to throw them away instead of turning them into the railroad company, as is the present custom. The tickets were given to Mr. Hinkle by his father, Peter B. Hinkle, of Erie, a retired Penna. railroad employee, who received them on the day the first passenger train was run over the division, he being on the

Chestnut Coal Going Up.
With the issuing by the anthracite coal companies of their circular for April, the price of chestnut coal probably will be advanced from \$3.75 \$4 per ton at the mines. 
