It was in 1876 that we first heard of the "dark horse," Mr. Hayes havbeen trotted out as that equine individual. There have been many at-tempts to hunt up the pedigree of the dark horse in politics, and the following has been generally the most satisfying: A few years "befo" de wah" there lived in Tennessee a trading horse jockey who had a coal black stallion, almost a thoroughbred. He entered this horse in a country race meeting where he was not known and where the natives heavily backed two or three favorites against him.
