#### CHRISTMAS 100 YEARS AGO.

Apprehension Felt From British Navy In the War of 1812,

Six months of the war of 1812 had elapsed when the people of the United tates celebrated Christmas a hundred vears ago. Hull had surrendered Detroit, but another Hull had won a deided victory over the British ship Guerriere, while another ship, the United States, had captured the Macenian. In New York a great Christnas banquet was given to Captain saac Hull, commanding the Constituon "Old Ironsides," which had won battle with the Guerriere, and to Captain Stephen Decatur, commander of the United States.

The banquet was given in the City otel, which occupied the whole front a block from Cedar to Thames treets, in the vicinity of Wall street. his was the last Christmas festival New York till after the signing of peace treaty, for in 1813 the city s plunged into black despair over e fear of the British navy and the istress that had been caused to our nmerce and shipping.
