MANY FARMERS ATTEND MEETING

More than 300 farmers from six counties of the state, 136 of whom were stockholders, attended the Fourth Annual Stockholders' meeting of the Hollidaysburg Production Credit Association, held in the old Jaha Temple, Altoona, January 14th.

H. R. Snogerger, New Enterprise vice president of the Association, was in charge of the meeting. He announced that the meeting was for the purpose of making a report to the stockholders on the progress made during the past year and to outline the Association's program for 1938.

A report of the Board of Directors and of the Executive Committee was made by Mr. V. Ross Nicodemus of Martinsburg, director for Blair County.

Secretary-treasurer, William H. Bishop, read the official minutes of the past session, and gave the treasurer's report of the Association. His report showed that membership had increased from 314 to 336 and that the volume of business had increased from \$177,000 to \$210,000.

SIMPLE SOIL SAVING SYSTEMS ARE IN USE

Simple systems for saving soil are recommended by extension agronomists of the Pennsylvania State College in controlling soil erosion. Eighty farm demonstrations have been started in all counties. In most cases vegetative control is used, the most common feature being strip cropping. The strips are laid out on the contour lines so that they run at right angles to the slope of the land.
