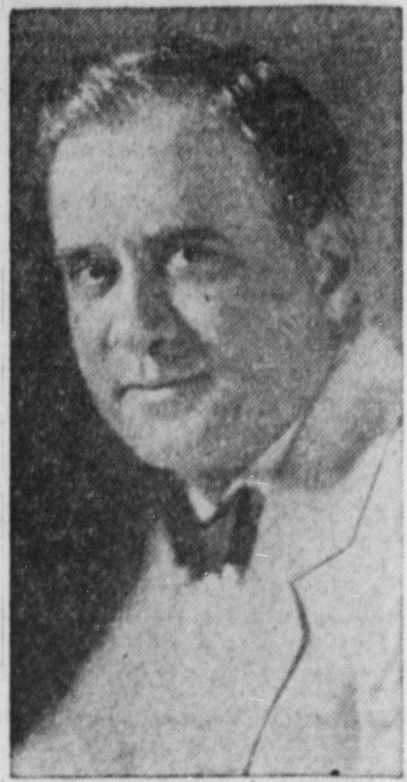

With various seedings and re-seedings again included among the most important soil-building practices for which payments will be made under the 1938 Agricultural Conservation Program, the Centre County Agricultural Conservation Committee today urged farmers who intend to carry out such practices under the program to make certain that they use the proper type of seed and comply with lime and fertilizer requirements.

In carrying out practices for the establishment of new seedings of a fall or winter clover, the committee points out, it is necessary to meet the required amount of hardy northern-grown domestic or Canadian seed.

## Centre County Has Significant Part In Air Mail Service Anniversary

The 20th anniversary of the inauguration of American air-mail service will be celebrated with a nation-wide observance of "Air Mail Week," May 15th to 21st. This is a national event of which every patriotic citizen of Centre county should be justly proud. For Centre county can claim credit for taking part in the pioneer work of this great undertaking that has knitted the vast expanses of our industrial empire into closer bonds. Our community was one of the first key positions selected by the government for an air mail station, and during the early days of its operation many of the country's most noted aviators found it an advantageous landing place on their cross-country flights. Air mail flying being in its infancy at the time, there were many tragedies to record, and the toll of pilots who lost their lives during the early years was very heavy. The first air mail pilot to lose his life in Centre county was Charles H. Ames, whose plane crashed against the mountain in the vicinity of Hecla Park, within 200 feet of the Hecla beacon. The tragedy occurred on the night of October 21, 1925. The dead pilot's body was found by John DeArmitt, after a search of ten days in which the National Guard was called upon to take part. In commemoration of the forthcoming anniversary, and in tribute to the memory of the first air mail pilot to give his life to the service in Centre county, we are reproducing a poem that was contributed to this newspaper and printed in its columns, following the death of Charles H. Ames.

### Our Missing Pilot

Out in sunny California  
Sat a mother aged and grey;  
She was wondering if they'd found him—  
Her brave son so far away.  
While in Central Pennsylvania  
Four days men searched in vain;  
Then perchance a young lad found him—  
He shall never fly again.  
Charles H. Ames, our missing pilot  
Was found closely to the light;  
He was seeking for a landing  
On that dark and foggy night.  
In the distance the light glimmered,  
The motors turned too slow,  
Not until he hit the tree tops  
Did he know he was too low.  
It was then Nittany Mountains  
Took the toll of a life so dear;  
He had gone to meet the Saviour  
While the light still glimmered near.  
Give our sympathies to his mother,  
To his father do the same—  
We shall never, never forget him,  
Charles H. Ames, an honored name.

### SATURDAY LAST DAY TO REGISTER

Saturday of this week will be the last opportunity Centre County voters will have to register for the primary election on May 17. If you have registered since June 1, 1937, you need not register unless:

- 1 You want to change your party affiliation.
- 2 You wish to file a change of address.
- 3 You have become disabled, and wish to apply for assistance on election day.

If you have NOT been registered since June 1, 1937, you are not covered by the permanent registration system. To vote in the primary, you must register before the close of the County Commissioners' offices at noon Saturday.

May 2 is the last day for electors to change party affiliations. This can be accomplished only by appearing personally at the County Commissioners' offices.

Reports from registrations which have been held in various districts throughout the county during the past week or more, indicate that the Democratic party has gained a larger number of members than has the Republican party. A complete tabulation is expected to be available early next week.
