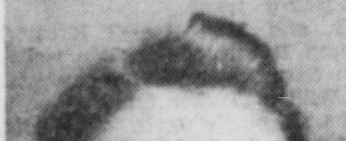
William F. Boob, Woodward, Found Dead in Yard; Used Small Calibre Rifle
