Mrs. Frank Peters, a native of Unionville, died at her home in West Decatur Saturday afternoon at the age of 84 years. Survivors include the following children: Mrs. James McGinley, Portage; Mrs. Jack Uzell, Kyertown; Charles Peters, Morgan Run, and Clarence, at home. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon, with interment in West Decatur.

MRS. WILLIAM HARTER

Mrs. William Harter died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Reading, at 3 o'clock Tuesday morning from complications following a month's illness. She was 49 years of age. Mrs. Harter was born on the Lewistown Pike, a daughter of James and Rebecca Shirk Flack. Her only survivors are a daughter, Miss Utalica, formerly of Bellefonte, now training in St. Joseph's Hospital, Reading, and a sister, Mrs. William Bryan, of Bellefonte. R. D. Funeral services will be held this Thursday morning at 11 o'clock from her late home in Reading and interment will be made in that city. Mrs. William Bryan and Mrs. William Harter of Bellefonte left yesterday to attend the funeral.

MRS. SARA JANE MUSSER

Mrs. Sara Jane Musser, last surviving member of one of the prominent early families in Spring township, passed away at her apartment over the O. A. Kline hardware store, West High street, Bellefonte, at 6:30 o'clock Tuesday evening after an illness with a complication of diseases. Had she lived until September 2, she would have observed her 91st birthday. The deceased was a daughter of Henry and Catherine Mease Miller, and was born on September 2, 1847, in Spring township in one of the stone houses erected by her father near the fish hatchery between Bellefonte and Pleasant Gap. Mr. Miller built the stone house near the Pleasant Gap station and also several similar houses on what is now the fish hatchery property. In 1859 Mrs. Musser was united in marriage with John J. Musser who passed away in 1901. Surviving are one daughter, Katherine, at home, and two step-daughters, Mrs. M. A. Kirk, of Bellefonte, and Mrs. Carrie Rhinehart, of Clearfield. Funeral services will be held at 2:30 o'clock Friday afternoon from the home, in charge of the Rev. William C. Thompson, pastor of the Bellefonte Presbyterian church. Interment will be made in the Union cemetery.

G. HOMER NOLL

George Homer Noll, prominent Tyrone resident, died at his home in Tyrone, last Thursday afternoon, two o'clock from coronary thrombosis. Mr. Noll had been ill since March 12 of this year. Mr. Noll was a son of George and Anna (Garbrick) Noll and was born at Milesburg, Centre county, on April 17, 1878. On September 16, 1908, at Milesburg, he was united in marriage with Miss Hannah Elizabeth Swartz, the ceremony being performed by the Rev. Mr. Howard. Mrs. Noll died on May 21, 1930. Mr. Noll had been a resident of Tyrone for 35 years. He is survived by three children: Mrs. William Stewart, of Altoona, Miss Doris Noll, and Miss Gladys Noll, of Tyrone, also one grandson, George Homer Stewart, of Altoona, and one brother, Emanuel Noll, of Milesburg. Mr. Noll was a member of the Milesburg Presbyterian church; Tyrone Lodge No. 494, Free and Accepted Masons; the I. O. O. F. Lodge of Milesburg; the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen; and Engineemen and the P. R. R. Relief association. He had been employed by the Pennsylvania Railroad company as a freight engineman on the Tyrone branch of the Middle Division, having entered the service as a fireman on October 23, 1899, and promoted to an engineman on September 10, 1907. He was well known in Bellefonte, and had planned to spend Memorial Day with his uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. James Selbert, on Pine Street. Funeral services were held from the home, Sunday afternoon, with burial in Tyrone.

DR. JOHN JOSEPH WENZKE

Dr. John Joseph Wenzke, physician and surgeon who was associated with Dr. Joseph Price at the Mercy Hospital in Columbus, Ohio, died at 1:15 o'clock Tuesday afternoon at the A. B. Beck residence at Snydertown after a lingering illness with tuberculosis. Dr. Wenzke and his wife, the former Mildred K. Beck, had been at the Beck family home since January 1, this year. Although he had suffered from tuberculosis for some years his condition did not become serious until after June 25, 1936, when he and his wife in less than a month after their marriage were involved in a motor crash at "Dead Man's Curve" near Nitany. Mrs. Wenzke was seriously injured, and while her husband escaped unhurt, the shock is believed to have caused a relapse of his illness. Dr. Wenzke was a son of Joseph and Theresa Wenzke and was born at Celina, Ohio, on November 27, 1902, making his age at time of death 35 years, 6 months, and 4 days. He married Miss Mildred K. Beck on June 1, 1936. Surviving in addition to his wife are a six-month-old son, John Joseph; five brothers and two sisters, namely: Dr. Herman Wenzke, head of the chemistry department at Notre Dame, South Bend, Ind.; Dr. Joseph and Dr. Frank Wenzke and Mrs. Catherine Bigger, all of Dayton, Ohio; Louis, attending medical college, and Carl, also in college, and Mrs. Frances Scharf, of Fostoria, Ohio. The remains will be taken by train today to Celina, Ohio, where funeral services will be held and interment made. Miss Eva Kimmel, a nurse, and Miss Miriam Beck, sister-in-law of the deceased, will leave today to attend the last rites. At the regular term of Civil Court in Bellefonte last week, Dr. Wenzke was a co-plaintiff in damage suits resulting from the accident which is reported to have contributed indirectly to his death.

ROBERT MILLS CARTER

Robert Mills Carter, aged 59 months, son of Louis J. and Helen Mills Carter, of Bellefonte, died Sunday morning of complications. The child had not been well since birth. Surviving are the parents and two brothers, Louis J. and Clayton T. Carter, both at home. Funeral services were held Monday with interment in the Union cemetery.

Laura Jane Ewing

Funeral services were held at the Koch Funeral Home in State College Tuesday afternoon for Laura Jane Ewing, 75, who died in the Harrisburg Hospital Sunday night of complications following an illness of several weeks. The services were in charge of the Rev. E. H. Jones and interment was made at Pine Hill. Born in Mt. Union, she deceased was a daughter of A. J. and Elizabeth Gayton Postlethwaite. She is survived by her husband, J. Morrison Ewing, a son, a daughter and a brother. She was a member of the Presbyterian church.

Charles Calvin Jones

Charles Calvin Jones, aged 59 years, son of Malcolm and Rosetta Jones of Boggs township, died at his parental home at 9:30 o'clock Friday morning after a two-day illness with a complication of diseases. He was born in Boggs township on August 25, 1932. Surviving are his parents and five brothers, namely: William, Malcolm, Edward, Donald, Lloyd, and a sister, Catherine, all at home. Funeral services were held from the Herbert Auman home, North Spring street, Bellefonte, Sunday afternoon, with the Rev. Clarence E. Arnold officiating. Interment was made in the Union cemetery, Bellefonte.

James Coyle

James Coyle, for the past two years employed as watchman and handyman at the Montgomery store was found dead in his bedroom in the basement of the store early Saturday morning a short time after the store was opened. Mr. Coyle, who was about 73 years old, came here four years ago and had been employed by John McCoy before accepting the post at the Montgomery store. Death is believed to have been the result of a heart attack suffered during the night. Funeral services were held Tuesday morning from St. John's Catholic church, Bellefonte, with the Rev. Mrs. Emma Minerva Bower, wife of A. F. Bower, of Aaronsburg, passed away at her home there at 3 o'clock yesterday morning after a lingering illness with arthritis. A daughter of Tobias and Catherine Horn Bailey, she was born in Centre county on March 12, 1862, making her age at time of death 76 years, 2 months and 19 days. Surviving are her second husband, A. F. Bower and one son, William Bariges, of near Penn Hill, a child by her first marriage. Funeral services will be held at 1:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon from the home, followed by services in the Aaronsburg Reformed church, with the Rev. G. A. Greising officiating. Interment will be made in the Millheim cemetery.
