(Continued from page one) defective flue may have been responsible since a water heater was in operation in the basement at the time. The fire was discovered simultaneously by several persons as flames broke out through the roof ridge.

Parsons was struck about the arms and shoulders by falling bricks as the chimney collapsed, and was saved from probable fatal injuries by his crash helmet. He was unconscious for a short time. Russell, treasurer, another member of the Alpha Company, received bruises about one foot while fighting the flames.

Joe Glenn, owner of the plant, had started with his family on a vacation earlier the same day. He was located by telephone after the fire and made arrangements to return to State College immediately to take charge of repairing the fire damage.
