TRACTOR STRIKES BEECH CREEK BARN, CAUSES \$7,000 FIRE

Crops, Farm Equipment and Four Calves Are Lost In Blaze On Joseph L. Bickel Farm When Machine Runs Wild and Causes Explosion

A tractor which ran wild on the Joseph L. Bickel farm, three miles east of Beech Creek about 4:30 o'clock last Wednesday afternoon caused a destructive fire which burned a large barn and its contents to the ground.

The Bickels had been threshing oats and most of the crop was in the barn which contained about 400 bushels of oats and 130 bushels of barley.

As Leonard Van Gorder, 22, of Flemington, one of the crew assisting Mr. Bickel, drove the tractor into the barn, pulling one of the last loads of oats, the accident happened.

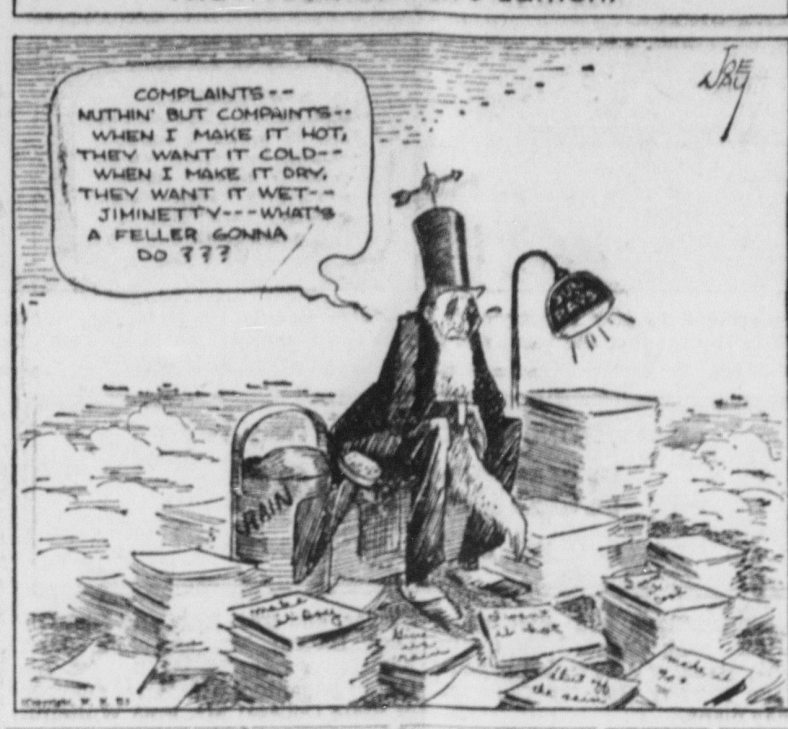

PHILIPSBURG MINISTER SUCCUMBS TO ILLNESS IN SEVENTIETH YEAR

Retired Five Weeks Ago When Health Failed; Would Have Observed 50th Anniversary In Gospel Work October 17

Rev. George S. Womer, D. D., late pastor of the Trinity Methodist church, Philipsburg, died Thursday, August 4th, at 2:45 p. m., at Roaring Spring, of complications after a five weeks' illness.

He had been taken to Roaring Spring last Wednesday morning from Trinity Methodist parsonage in the hope that the change would be a contributing factor in bettering his physical health.

When Dr. Womer's health broke five weeks ago, he asked to be retired from his duties as pastor of Trinity church, and it was with reluctance that acceptance was made.

Rev. Womer was born at Osceola Mills November 9, 1868, a son of David R. P. and Jane Elizabeth (Cunningham) Womer, and when he was three weeks old his parents moved to Reynoldsville, where he was reared to young manhood.

In 1894 he married Miss Angeline Blake, a New England lady. She died a number of years ago. To this union there survive three sons, namely: Blake Womer, an attorney of Cleveland, Ohio; Marcus D. Womer, of Syracuse, N. Y.; and N. F. Womer, an attorney of DuBois.

Five brothers and sisters survive, also seven grandchildren. While serving as pastor of the Shamokin Methodist church he married Miss Ruth E. Stroup, of Shamokin, then a deaconess in that church.

It was during his teaching career at Jansville, Clearfield county, that he received his local preacher's license on October 17, 1888. He would have observed his 50th anniversary in active gospel work this October 17.
