

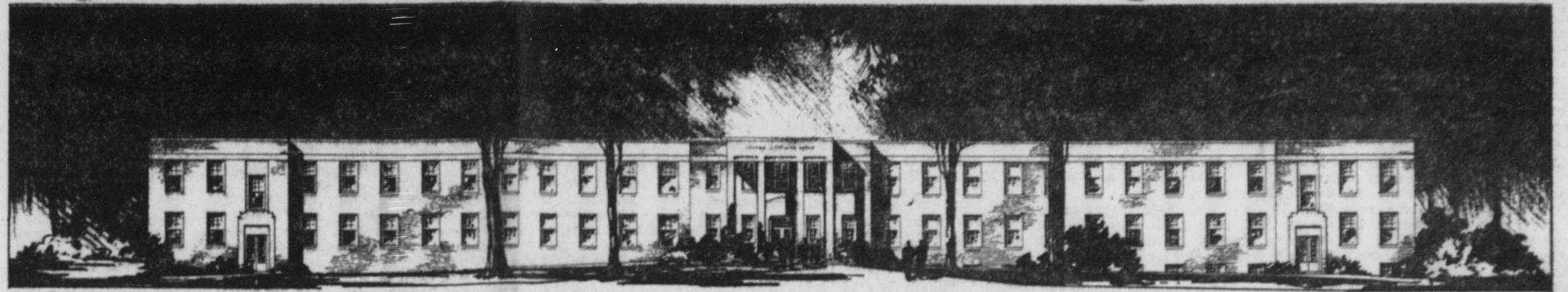
## DISPOSAL PLANT IS ASSURED
