Surviving are his other sisters, Mrs. Annie Rohrbaugh, who also resides with Mrs. Long; Mrs. Alice Duck, of State College; Mrs. Elizabeth Swartz, of Rebersburg; Mrs. Minnie Rohrbaugh, of Jersey Shore; two brothers, William, State College, and Ed., of near Rebersburg. The funeral was held at the church at Madisonburg, Centre county, at 2:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon.

ALVIN CLAYTON WILSON. Alvin Clayton Wilson, veteran of the World War, died at his home in Millheim at 9:30 o'clock Monday night after a week's illness with a complication of diseases. Mr. Wilson was employed as a laborer, was a son of Samuel S. and Sarah Wilson, and was born at Coburn on November 14, 1896, making his age at time of death 41 years, 10 months and 12 days. He was never married and is survived by the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. James Shesley, Beach Creek, R. D.; Eva S. White, Philadelphia; Jesse H. Wilson, Frederick, Md.; Mrs. Earl Smith, Potters Bank; Theodore and Clair, Millheim; Clifford, of Lynchburg, Va., and Mrs. Hayes Ralston, of Centre Hall. Mr. Wilson was a member of Keystone Post, No. 44, American Legion, Millheim. Funeral services will be held this Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the home, in charge of the Rev. G. A. Fred Greising. Interment will be made in the Fairview cemetery, Millheim.

MINER WORKER FATALLY HURT WHILE WALKING ON HIGHWAY. Struck by a car as he was walking on the highway, one mile outside of Osceola on the Osceola-Phillipsburg highway Monday night, Anthony Grubutsky, 50, New Liberty, died of injuries early Tuesday morning at the Phillipsburg State Hospital. Grubutsky was walking towards Phillipsburg at 9:05 p. m. when he was hit by a car operated by William McLaren, Osceola Mills, which was traveling in the same direction. Hurling between a guide post and the concrete road on the right hand side of the road, the victim was still living when examined by Wilmer Hoover, Sandy Ridge, but succumbed nine hours later at the hospital from a fractured skull. He never regained consciousness after being taken to Phillipsburg. According to the motor police, McLaren was driving with his lights on low beam. Grubutsky is said to have been dressed in dark clothes and walking in the middle of the road from a fractured skull. Grubutsky, who had been making his home in bachelor quarters near the mine where he was employed in the New Liberty territory is survived by his father, a brother and a sister. He was not married. He came to this country 45 years ago from Russia.

LOCAL STORE SAYING IT WITH TULIPS. From all indications Bellefonte will be considerably beautified next Spring through the numerous plantings of tulip bulbs now being made. Brachbill's report that the Rainbow collection of Dutch tulip bulbs they announced in connection with their participation in the celebration of the tenth anniversary of the Spring-Air Mattress, has made a big hit, and that the boxes of bulbs have been going like hot cakes. On the basis of the number of bulbs locally distributed, they have made the interesting computation that if all the distributors of this offer throughout the country are enjoying an equal demand, a total of five million bulbs would be required to satisfy the requests. National headquarters at Holland, Michigan, announced that they could take care of orders up to a million and a half, but beyond that there was some question whether there would be any more bulbs available.
