untruth even in a joking way. Sunday was not the only anniversary for Mr. Fink. Thirty years ago the previous Tuesday he was elected treasurer of Centre county, and 53 election days ago he moved from Clearfield county to Centre county. He is a staunch Republican and derived a lot of enjoyment out of last week's election. His children say he eats, breathes and dreams politics.

Mr. Fink's life has been an active one and he served his fellowmen a good many of his 77 years in various public offices. In his younger years he held a variety of township offices, including township supervisor and school director. In 1896 he was elected auditor of Centre county. He next served as county mercantile appraiser and was then elected to the treasurer post.

After moving to Phillipsburg from his farm in the Bald Eagle Valley in 1921, he was appointed to the borough council to fill an unexpired two year term. He was then elected to council and was its president for two years before resigning because of ill health.

After his retirement from the wholesale hardware business in 1922 he was appointed Inheritance Tax appraiser and served in that capacity until last year, since which time he has lived retired.

Mr. Fink was born May 9, 1863, near New Millport, Clearfield county. He was one of the ten children of George W. and Mary L. Fink. He was only six years old when the panic of '99 occurred and only ten when the '73 panic took place.

The fact that Mr. Fink met with far more than ordinary success was due only through individual effort as he is truly a self-made man. When he was fourteen years old he left home and lived with an uncle on his farm nearby. For nine years he worked at farming, teaming and in the lumber woods.

In the fall of 1885 he moved to another uncle's farm near Martha Furnace and worked it on shares. He soon purchased a tract of timber and in time owned two adjacent farms. He specialized and was remarkably successful with raising pure bred stock.

While living with his uncle, J. Q. Miles, near Martha Furnace, he met and married Miss Selma Williams, a daughter of Joseph F. and Hannah Records Williams, Martha Furnace. Her father was a prominent and influential resident engaged in farming, mercantile and lumber business. He was an extensive land owner. Mrs. Fink was one of eight children and was born January 14, 1862, near Martha Furnace. The couple was married November 13, 1885, at Stormstown by Rev. W. F. D. Noble.

Mr. and Mrs. Fink were born to this union and all are living. Their names are as follows:

Telford, Joseph and Doro, who are together in the hardware business in Tyrone; Clair, a farmer and implement dealer of Woodland; Mrs. Iva Pearle Steel, wife of C. W. Steel, mechanic in the Altoona railroad shops; George, who is a farmer and lives on the farm retained near Martha Furnace; Theodore, who is employed by the Harbison Walker Refractories at Clearfield; Myron and Wade, who operate the local Sunoco filling station.

They are grandparents to 26 grandchildren and great-grandparents to four great-grandchildren. Mrs. Fink has one brother and Mr. Fink has two sisters living. The Finks are of the Baptist faith. Mr. Fink has been a member of the Unionville Grange for many years.

Quail On Toast.

Wipe dressed quails inside out with a damp cloth. Put 1 spoonful of highly seasoned dressing in each bird. Press carefully, letting legs stand up instead of down, as with a chicken. Tie a thin slice of bacon around each leg. Roast in a hot oven 15 to 20 minutes. Baste frequently with a mixture of butter and hot water, salt and pepper. Serve on slices of toast moistened with broth from the quails. Garnish with parsley and green grape jelly.

Panned Oysters.
1 quart oysters.
4 tablespoons butter.
1 teaspoon salt.
2 teaspoons finely grated onion.
1 teaspoon parsley, chopped.
1/4 teaspoon pepper.
1 cup of top milk or thin cream.
1/4 teaspoon paprika.
Toast.

Drain the oysters in a colander, removing all juice. Place the butter in a frying pan until it melts. Add the grated onion, oysters, salt pepper and paprika. Cook for 5 minutes or until the oysters curl on the edges. Add the cream and parsley and serve immediately on buttered toast.
