This time of the year every house-keeper is busy planning her cakes for the Christmas feast.

There are two kinds of fruit cake, a dark one, which is heavily spiced, made with brown sugar or molasses, which adds to the spicy flavor.

- Black Fruit Cake No. 1
1 dozen eggs
1 pound sugar
1 pound butter
1 1/2 pounds flour

The flour should be slightly browned in the oven before commencing the cake.

- White Fruit Cake No. 1
1/2 pound butter
1/2 cup sugar
4 eggs

- Poor Man's Cake
1/2 cup butter
1 cup sugar

- 1 cup watermelon rind preserves
2 teaspoons baking powder
2 eggs

- Ribbon Fruit Cake
2 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
1 teaspoon each baking powder and salt

- Light Fruit Cake
2 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
1 teaspoon each of baking powder and salt

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who conduct it locally. Then, too, this local farmer-supervisor committee emphasizes the democratic character of the program's administration.

These committeemen not only explain the provisions of the program but they help the individual farmer apply these provisions to best advantage on his farm.

Through maintenance of Agricultural Adjustment Administration records of the county they have developed a collection of information that has never before been available. This information on acreage and yields affords farmers the most accurate view they have ever had of their own operations as groups of producers.

The operation of the farm program represents the true democratic process, the committee urged, pointing out that the program is designed by the farmers for the farmers and operated by them.

These farmers meet in their various communities, as at the forthcoming meetings and elect three members of the community committee, together with two alternates. They also elect a delegate and alternate to the county convention which, in turn, elects the county committee consisting of three members. Two alternates are also selected.

This is the procedure that farmers will follow here as elsewhere throughout the country. The committee stated, in selecting those who are to conduct the Agricultural Observation Program for them locally.

collapse of the financial structure of that country. Hitler came to a people defeated in war, suffering under an unjust treaty of peace, impoverished; he came making promises that meant restoration of self respect and national honor.

During the summer, when he made his last visit to Germany, Hitler said that the German people was very mild, and that he bought merchandise in Jewish shops and saw no one molested.

The philosophy of National Socialism as it is in Germany is the second element which enters into the present situation and affects not only the Jews, but also the Protestants and Roman Catholic churches.

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passed he saw the man a short distance ahead of him. He applied the brakes but the wheels slid on the snow and the car slid into the man.

Continuing his account of the mishap, Mr. Reddes stated he stopped his car, and together with Philip Witteralt, of East Bishop Street, Bellefonte, who had been following the Reddes machine, helped Mr. Lucas to his feet.

Mr. Lucas was conscious and stood up without assistance. He was placed in the Reddes car and talked with the driver on the way to the Hospital until they reached Milesburg, when he appeared to become quiet.

Both Mr. Reddes and Mr. Witteralt declared that the road had been plowed, and that Mr. Lucas was walking in the cleared part, directly in the path of traffic approaching from his rear. It is believed that owing to traffic coming from the opposite direction, he failed to see the lights of the Reddes car in back of him.

State Motor Police officer Andrew Hudica, of the Pleasant Gap station, the only other person to testify, reported having investigated the accident, but because the man and the car had been moved from the scene when he arrived there, he couldn't testify as to how the mishap occurred.

After hearing the testimony the members of the Governor's Jury, Cameron Hevry, John Miller, Gilbert Noll, Fred B. Healy, Carl Crommiller and P. M. Dubbe, all of Bellefonte, were unanimous in their verdict that the accident had been unavoidable, and that Mr. Reddes was in no way guilty of contributory negligence.

Escaped Death Month Ago

On October 29, this year, the victim of the Thanksgiving Day accident, narrowly escaped death when the store and home of Mrs. Ida Witter, at Wingate, where he resided, was struck by a truck loaded with nine tons of coal.
