**OTIS MACE.**  
Otis Mace, a former resident of Lock Haven and the father of Mrs. Hazel Miller of Howard R. D., died Tuesday of last week at his home in Waterville, N. Y. Mr. Mace lived in Lock Haven for many years, being employed at the North American Refractories and American Aniline plants. He moved to Waterville eleven years ago, farming for several years before retiring. Interment was made in the Dunns town cemetery, Clinton county.

**JAMES W. MACKEY.**  
James W. Mackey, 84, retired farmer, died at Mackeysville, Friday morning at 8:30, of complications incident to old age. Surviving are the following sons and daughters: Mrs. Edward Hazel, Syracuse, N. Y.; James W. Rochester, N. Y.; Frank J. Howard, R. D.; Mrs. Walter Miller, Mackeysville; Mrs. Rachel Robb, Rockwell; and Albert D. Mackey, of Altoona, also survives. **DR. ALVIN L. RHOTON.**  
Dr. Alvin L. Rhoton, professor emeritus of the Pennsylvania State College, died in an Agdensburg, N. Y., hospital last Wednesday night, at the age of 71 years. He had been making his home with a daughter, Miss Lee Hunt of Canton. Dr. Rhoton was born in Somerset, Ky., March 23, 1867. He had been professor of Education at Penn State for 18 years, until his retirement at 70. He married Miss Ethel Baugh, who died four years ago. In addition to his daughter, Mrs. Hunt, whose husband is Professor of Education at St. Lawrence University in Canton, he is survived by a son, Dr. Paul Rhoton, of Furman University, Greenville, S. C., and two granddaughters, Barbara and Paula Hunt of Canton.

**MISS HELEN FORSHEY.**  
Miss Helen Forshey, a grade teacher in the Philipsburg public schools for the past forty-seven years, died in the Philipsburg State Hospital Friday afternoon of a heart ailment, superinduced by complications. She had been critically ill for two months prior to which she seemed to enjoy a reasonable degree of health. Miss Forshey had rounded out forty-seven terms as a school teacher and had taught the first month of the present term before she became ill. A native of Tyrone, Miss Forshey went to Philipsburg with her parents, the late Jonathan and Martha Forshey, when she was about ten years of age. She had lived there since that time. After graduating from the Philipsburg High School, Miss Forshey attended the Indiana State Normal School, later taking special work at the Pennsylvania State College. She was a member of the Presbyterian church and belonged to the Eastern Star of Coeola Mills; John and William Forshey, Mrs. Annie Mason and Miss Emma Forshey, all of Philipsburg, and Mrs. Grace Waldron, of Malvern. Private funeral services were conducted at her late home on Monday afternoon and burial made in Philipsburg cemetery.

**MRS. KATHERINE E. HENRY.**  
Mrs. Katherine E. Henry, 77, died at her home in Jersey Shore, at 12:50 o'clock Saturday morning, following an illness of two years. She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. William Hunter of Jersey Shore and Mrs. Oliver Edkins, of Easton; two sons, John, at home; and Raymond, of Jersey Shore; two sisters, Mrs. Allen Shive, of Snow Shoe and Mrs. Clara Kohler, of Williamsport; and three brothers, William, Peter and Edward Hauser, all of Snow Shoe; by eight grand children and two great-grandchildren.

Funeral services for Emory E. Emert were conducted at 2 p. m. Sunday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Guy Nolan, Nittany, where he died last Thursday following a long illness with sugar diabetes. He had been confined to bed for two years. A native of Sallona, he spent his entire life in that section and was aged 69 years. Survivors are his wife, three sons: Richard, Earl and Clarence Emert, all of Lock Haven; one daughter, Mrs. Nolan, and two brothers, Harry and Terrence, of Sallona. William Milford Kreamer, well known resident of Woodward, died at his home there about 6 o'clock Sunday morning after an illness with cancer. **WALTER LEROY KLINE.**  
Walter LeRoy Kline Vandergriff, business man and a prominent figure in the American Legion Post, died early Thanksgiving morning, November 24, 1938, in the Veterans Administration hospital in New York, N. Y. Mr. Kline was 44 at the time of his death, was born November 9, 1894, at State College. He was a son of James O. Kline and Anna Hobbs Kline. Mr. Kline had been suffering from a throat ailment for some time and underwent a laryngectomy in the Veterans' hospital on November 7th. His work in the Legion was outstanding. He was elected commander to serve the year from October 1937 to October of this year. Of the 18 commanders who have headed the post since its organization in 1919, he was the first to die. During the World War he served in the coast defense for 18 months. Besides being a member of the Legion, he was also a member of the First United Presbyterian church. Mr. Kline went to Vandergriff from DuBois in 1922 and worked for the H. J. Kuhns company for 10 years. After leaving the company he established his own business. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Miriam Kline, one daughter, Elizabeth Ann Kline, at home and two brothers, William H. Kline, Brookville, and Charles R. Kline, McKeesport.
