

BURNING SAFE METHOD FOR REMOVING STUMPS

Dead tree stumps near buildings or other places where damage might result from the use of dynamite or black powder may be removed by burning.

This can be accomplished by drilling 8 to 12-inch diagonal holes 8 to 10 inches apart in a stump using a brace and a one-inch bit.

Under ordinary conditions, the stump will burn rapidly at first. Then it may smoulder for several more days.

INDIAN POTTERY SPECIMEN FOUND IN CENTRE COUNTY

The most perfect specimen of Indian pottery found in central Pennsylvania is being preserved in the museum of the school of mineral industries at the Pennsylvania State College.

The object is a small pot, with a capacity of about two gallons which was found in a rock crevice in the Tussey mountains by Melvin Eilenberger of Pine Grove Mills, Centre county, while he was hunting foxes last fall.

C. W. Robinson, associate professor of geology and curator of the mineral industries museum at the college, believes the pot was made by a member of the tribe of Delaware Indians of Lenapes.

"The pot was probably used as a cooking utensil," Professor Robinson said. "As it does not show evidence of having been placed on a fire, the cooking was probably done by the introduction of heated stones to produce boiling."

CAN MEAT FOR VARIETY IN SUMMER MENUS

"Preserve surplus fresh meat" is an excellent slogan for Pennsylvania homemakers to adopt.

The task of canning meat which is not sold or which will not be used fresh falls on the homemaker.

Miss Helen S. Butler, home economics extension representative of Centre county, recommends the hot pack method for canning meat.

The less tender cuts may be precooked by placing uniform pieces of about one pound each into boiling water and simmering 12 to 20 minutes in a partly covered kettle.

Keeping Plants Watered If you are going away for a few days and wish to keep the house plant watered while you are gone, one successful way is to soak a large sponge with water and place it on the dirt in the pot.

Washing Rice The easiest way to wash rice is to place it in a sieve and let the cold water continue to run through until it comes through clear and free from starch.

Scorched Linen If the linen is not scorched too badly, a cut onion rubbed on the marks, and then a good soaking in cold water, will remove the scorches.

Cleaning Mirrors Rub the mirror with a ball of soft paper slightly dampened with methylated spirits, then with a duster on which a little whiting has been sprinkled, and finally polish with clean paper or a wash leather.

Useful Kitchen Implement A useful and economical kitchen utensil may be made from a large tablespoon pounded out flat. It is more effective than a spatula or spoon, being firm and flat.

Less Flavor The strong flavor of fowl may be modulated if celery is diced and put into the dressing.

TIRED WARDROBE BACK TO WORK WITH NEW LIFE

After the rush of holidays, winter clothes often seem to need some special care. Loose fasteners, sagging hems, or wrinkles stare you in the face.

Garments that are shiny from constant wear, may be renewed by brushing with a stiff brush or sponging with a warm vinegar or ammonia solution.

The well-dressed woman keeps her clothes in repair so "lighten up" is a good tip. Sew on loose snaps and buttons, restore sagging hems—some may need to be rehung, and sew up seams that are split.

Baggy skirts need careful pressing, using lots of steam and a hot iron.

Steaming also helps to revive velvet, corduroys, and divetines. Hang the garments in the bathroom with a few inches of steaming water in the tub and the door windows tightly closed.

None of us like to get our hats, coats, or skirts wet from rain or snow. But if we are caught unawares, we can prevent our garments from becoming "lucky" if we shake them as dry as possible and put them on hangers where they will not touch anything else.

Heavily embroidered linens are and laundries. Simple designs may be worked out easily when linens are purchased by the yard.

Whitewashing Farm Buildings—Nothing improves the appearance of unpainted farm buildings more at a lower cost than a good coat of whitewash, say specialists at the Pennsylvania State College.

Dampness Weakens Ropes—Thoroughly drying a rope that has become wet and storing it in a dry place is advised by specialists at Penn State.

Dry Basement—If your basement has a tendency to be wet, it may be remedied by better ventilation.

Using Locally Grown Timber—Rough-sawn lumber has many uses on a farm. According to Penn State forestry extension specialists, it is advisable to stack and air dry for at least six months before use.

Brown Evergreen Needles—Don't be alarmed at slight browning of pine and arborvitae foliage. Usually it is merely the shedding of old needles from smaller twigs.

Know what to buy before you buy, is good advice to prospective buyers, believes Miss Helen S. Butler, home economics extension representative of Centre county.

A good buy in a towel is one that will wear well, absorb water readily, dry quickly, is convenient in size, and launders easily.

Good wearing quality depends principally on strong yarns and the terry weave that makes the fabric. Yarns should not be too tightly twisted for good absorbency.

The best terry weave shows rows of long, soft, even loops of yarns held firmly in place by double rows of both lengthwise and crosswise threads.

When these loops are fluffy, long, and close together, they absorb moisture readily. In loosely woven towels the ground as well as the loops gets wet and the towel dries slowly.

Colored and figured bath towels are higher in price because of the extra work connected with the dyeing and the weaving on special looms.
