is divided into four areas, of which the local troop is in the third. These four areas could produce an army of two million men. It would require perhaps a year to equip and get such an army in shape, especially physically so as to endure the rigors of a war campaign.

by the Governor of the Commonwealth. The regimental headquarters are at Tyrone. In time of war the machine gun officer of the regiment and the troop is broken up into three platoons. The troop consists of seventy men and four officers. There is a turnover of from forty to fifty each year, so that there is a need of this number of enlistments each year. The troop is anxious to have a fine type of young manhood. Two hours a week are devoted to drill, for which the member is allowed one dollar. Two weeks are spent in camp for which the men are paid. Uniforms and practically all clothing are supplied. Thirty-two horses are assigned to the local outfit, and about \$20,000 a year is brought into the community and spent largely in local circles in support of this troop.
