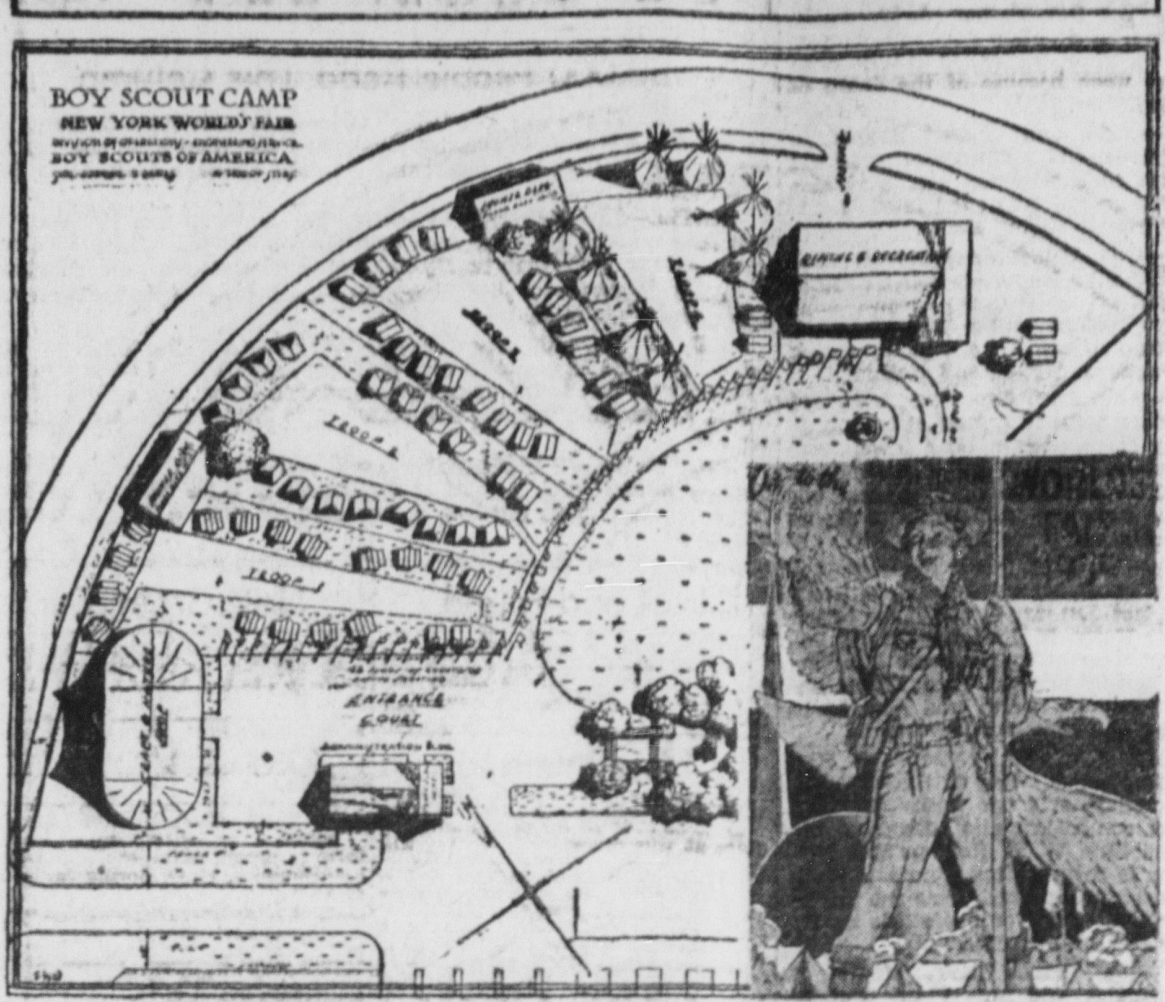

Boy Scouts Building World's Fair Camp



Layout of the two-acre Boy Scout camp at the New York World's Fair, to be used by 3000 different Scouts and leaders from all sections of the United States during the fair season.

Any qualified member of the Boy Scouts of America may apply for an opportunity to take part in a unique demonstration and service camp at the New York World's Fair.

The plan for a Scout camp of approximately 150 different Scouts and leaders each week, on a two-acre site within the fair grounds from April 30 to October 31, was approved by formal action of the managers of the World's Fair Corporation and the National Council, Boy Scouts of America.

The camp, to be located immediately adjacent to the Federal Building, will accommodate four troops of Scouts and four leaders.

The camp will be equipped with tents of various colors and designs. There will be a large tent for the display of Scouting including woodcraft, handicraft and campcraft. There will be opportunity for Troops that

have produced outstanding articles of handicraft and campcraft to have them shown in this tent at the World's Fair and the many exhibits within the fair grounds.

Contacts with Officials: Service projects will be an important part of a Scout's program during the fair season.

There will be accommodations for only 3,000 of the 1,271,000 present registered Scout membership, most of whom, judging from requests already on hand, would like to avail themselves of this privilege.

The opportunity will be open to Scouts in any part of the United States who meet the standards prescribed by the National Council, and preference will be given to applications in the order of their receipt.

All camp reservations must be made through local Scout Councils and not directly with the National Council.

Council Moves To Adopt Ordinance

(Continued from Page 1)

The committee, with Arthur C. Hewitt as spokesman, and with the following membership: Mrs. George B. Thompson, E. L. Plumb and Thomas M. Hays, pointed out that a zoning regulation would protect property values, establish building lines and otherwise regulate building in the borough.

The Street Committee was given power to make further study of a WPA sidewalk construction project, and to act toward sponsoring such a project if it is decided that the project is needed here.

Under the proposed ordinance, no building would be allowed where in town at a minimum cost to the property owner, and at the same time the borough would be allowed for each foot of sidewalk construction, a quantity of Amesite to be used in repairing streets.

Plan calling for the construction of a one-story brick case church building on the S. D. Ray property on East Howard Street, just opposite the site of the Union cemetery, was submitted to the council and approved by Council. The edifice, to be erected by the Christian and Missionary Alliance congregation, will have basement Sunday School and social rooms.

Council approved a recommendation by the Logan Fire Company that the following members be named as fire equipment drivers for the coming year: Philip Gross, Herman Hays, Arthur Book, Andrew Sawyer, Fred Blair and Fred Long.

It was reported that the West Penn Power Company will soon begin work on the revamping of the borough's ornamental street lighting system.

A bill for \$40.30 from the Bellefonte Restaurant, South Allegheny Street, for food served to firemen the night of the Logan building fire, was finally approved for payment after a lengthy discussion.

Councilmen Brockhoff and Thomas voted against payment of the bill, claiming among other things that the bill was not itemized properly, and that a charge of \$15.00 for coffee seemed excessive.

To prevent recurrence of similar bills in the future, the fire department arranged a system whereby an accurate check will be kept on all foods purchased by firemen while on duty. Council, Monday night, did not object to the fact that firemen purchased food on the borough's account, but that there are no records to show how many firemen were served or the extent of the charges.

Mrs. Betty Ory Driscoll in a letter to Council asked that part of her property on East Curtin Street be released as security for a \$500 mortgage held by Council for the Pruner Estate. The matter was referred to the Finance Committee.
