report from Hunter & Caldwell, Altoona architects, on the condition of the walls and foundation. In the report it was declared that the exterior brick walls above the first floor are entirely unsuitable for further use, having been twisted and warped by heat and having been further forced out of plumb by the expansion and twisting of steel girders during the fire. The walls are dangerous and should be demolished at once, the report recommended.

are undamaged, but they are of questionable value in any new building program. The use of the foundations in a new building would seriously limit the design and utility of any new structure, and the process might develop into a case of designing the structure to fit the foundations, the report stated.

It also was brought out that in the event the present foundations were used in a new building, windows would have to be enlarged and new ones added for the oil building was not adequately provided with natural lighting. These changes would be quite costly, it was stated.

In discussing the matter the board expressed the hope that the salvage of stone, brick and steel in the building would be sufficient to pay for the cost of removing the ruins. To place the matter on a competitive basis, unanimous action was taken to have Hunter & Caldwell prepare specifications covering the demolition of the building and clearing of the site. The advertisement for bids on the work appears in this week's issue of the local newspapers.

During the discussion on probable sites for a new building, it was reported by representatives of Hunter & Caldwell that the average amount of ground recommended by the State Department of Public Instruction for high school plants in towns of the size of Bellefonte is approximately 10 acres. This provides for future expansion; for outdoor physical education programs; gardens for vocational agriculture students, and for other activities. Matters of traffic congestion; ground elevations; light and air, and many other factors must be taken into consideration, the architects reported.

Board member James R. Hughes reported that wainscoting in several rooms and a maple floor in another room of the damaged high school building have been removed, and asked whether anyone had given permission for such removal. Mr. Stock reported that he had given the janitors permission to take out what wood they wished, pointing out that very little of it could be salvaged without great damage. The Board discussed increasing insurance on other school properties, and suggested minor changes at the Academy to reduce fire hazards and relieve congestion in study halls.
