In the annual report of the company's business it is stated that although there was considerable activity on the Bellefonte Central during the past year because of the building program at Penn State, revenues show only a slight gain over the previous year. A 48 per cent increase in revenues on freight shipped to State College was offset by a decrease of 47.4 per cent in revenues on freight derived from the lime industries served by the road. Then, too, the report continues, most of the traffic had to be carried over a longer haul, increasing handling expenses and keeping operating costs near the 1927 total. The report points out that since the college building program is nearly completed, with no prospect of any other new buildings to be erected during the coming year, the road must look to an early settlement of the affairs of the Chemical Lime Company now operating under Federal trusteeship, and the development of new enterprises along the line if the road's earnings are to be maintained at their present level.

In regard to improvements made during the year, the annual report notes that 92 additional carloads of stone ballast were spread on the main line; many rails were replaced and ties renewed; a comprehensive program of road control was carried out, and a locomotive, 25 per cent heavier than any previously owned by the company, was purchased. These improvements enabled the company to resume special passenger service during the Christmas holidays. This service will probably be continued the report said, but will be seasonal in character. 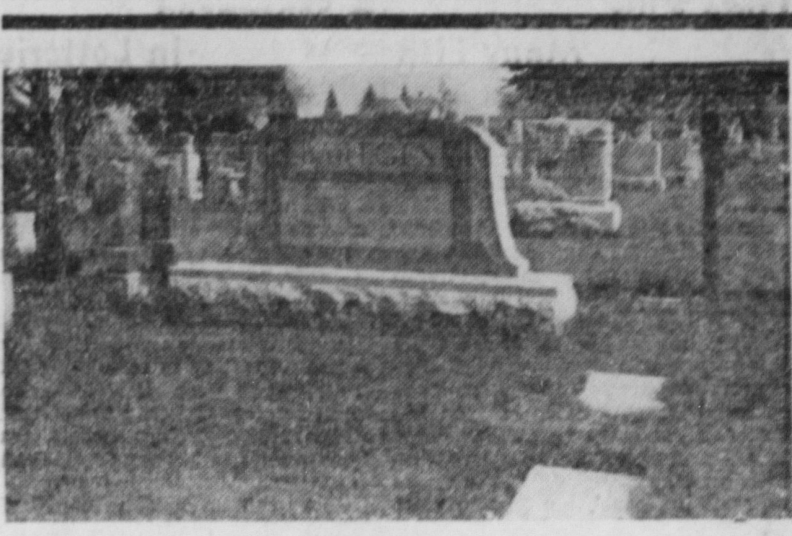
