AMERICAN MOTORISTS REDUCE TRAFFIC DEATHS

American motorists in the last 17 months have organized themselves into an army of life savers, discarding many of their careless, discourteous traffic habits, and have completely revised the trend of traffic fatalities.

In these 17 months, reports the American Petroleum Institute of Rockefeller Center, 3,900 lives have been saved by safety-minded motorists.

The constant increase in traffic accidents reported from month to month was the despair of safety engineers, traffic experts and other officials. Each year the deaths in traffic represent the population of an American city of about 40,000 people. The first reduction in traffic deaths for a full year was shown in 1938 and the downward trend has continued into 1939. In the first 4 months of this year, there were 8 percent fewer traffic deaths than in the same period in 1938, according to the report.
