VEGETABLE EXHIBITS RESULT OF HARD WORK

Almost everyone enjoys visiting vegetable exhibits at county fairs, but few realize the number of things judges must consider before naming the winning ribbons on the best exhibits...

According to W. B. Nissley, extension specialist in vegetable gardening with the Pennsylvania State College, successful exhibitors follow a few simple, but important rules.

Naturally, since vegetables are grown primarily for food, quality is important. Nissley states, "Quality is determined by the age and tenderness of the product."

In preparing his exhibit, the exhibitor must select specimens uniform in size, shape, color, maturity and smoothness. The most desirable vegetables are those medium in size for the particular variety.

Ed. Haupt met with some serious trouble, situated along the state highway leading from Bellefonte to Milesburg, which is now known as Haupt's Place, where he now resides.

Ed. Haupt was married some thirty years ago to Lida M. Hillier of Mansfield, Pa. Both have enjoyed the best of health and have worked hard to gain the position they now enjoy.

MOST CAR OWNERS EARN LESS THAN \$20 A WEEK

One third of the car owners in the United States have weekly incomes of \$20 or less, according to a recent survey made by the American Petroleum Institute in Rockefeller Center.

The survey shows that 15 per cent of the car owners have incomes of \$10 or less a week. Eighteen per cent are in the \$10 to \$20 a week bracket.

The survey also shows that the average value of all the cars on the highways is only \$200.
