Mr. Sharp was a son of George and Ruth Sharp and was born in Bellefonte on July 10, 1860, making his age at time of death 79 years, 1 month and 22 days. He moved to Trafford 22 years ago and at the time of his retirement in 1930 ranked as a veteran employe of the Westinghouse Company. He was a charter member of the Logan Fire Company, Bellefonte. His wife, the former Susan Sprankie, passed away nearly eight years ago. Survivors, in addition to the sister, Mrs. Waite, are two daughters, Mrs. E. E. Sasse, of Pittsburgh, and Mrs. Ida Kreamer, of Trafford, four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. The remains were brought to the E. E. Widdowson Funeral Home, North Allegheny street, Bellefonte, where funeral services were held Monday afternoon, followed by interment in the Union cemetery, Bellefonte.

### THOMAS DANIEL O'NEAL

Thomas Daniel O'Neal, retired Johnstown mail carrier, who for the past eight years had made his home with his son-in-law and daughter, former Judge Arthur C. Dale and Mrs. Dale, of East Linn street, died there suddenly at 6:30 o'clock Sunday night, death being attributed to a cerebral hemorrhage. Mr. O'Neal had been in good health for some time, and about a year ago his right leg was amputated as the result of a condition resulting from diabetes. A son of Major James T. and Elizabeth Berger O'Neal, he was born in Philadelphia on September 24, 1854, which made his age at time of death 84 years, 11 months and 9 days. Surviving are two daughters, Mrs. Dale, of Bellefonte, and Mrs. Charles A. Miller, of Wumber, and two grandchildren, Arthur C. Dale, Jr., and Frances Dale, both of Bellefonte. His wife, the former Emma Jones, passed away 11 years ago. At the age of 19 years, Mr. O'Neal became one of Johnstown's three original mail carriers when free delivery first began in that city. He became a beer during the Johnstown flood when he saved a fellow employe from death as the postmaster and other postal employes were swept away on the tide. He also played an important part in relief work after the flood, being appointed supervisor of

a commissary by the late Governor Daniel H. Hastings and Col. J. L. Sparger, both of Bellefonte, who were in charge of relief work. He was in full charge of postal facilities until the system was reorganized after the flood. Mr. O'Neal was a member of the Johnstown fire department when that city had nothing but volunteer fighting organizations. The body remained at the Widdowson Funeral Home, North Allegheny street, until yesterday when removal was made to the Picking Funeral Home at Johnstown where funeral services were held yesterday afternoon, with the Rev. H. M. Anderson, pastor of the Franklin street Methodist church officiating. Interment was made in the Grandview cemetery, Johnstown with brief Masonic services at the grave.

### GEORGE E. ISHLER

George E. Ishler, well known resident of Potter township, died at his home near Centre Hall at 1:30 o'clock yesterday morning after a lingering illness with a complication of diseases. He had been bedfast for the past seven weeks. Mr. Ishler was a son of George and Julianne Armagast Ishler and was born at Colyer on July 15, 1856, making his age at time of death 83 years, 1 month and 21 days.
