

Ballots Filled With Write-Ins

Election Boards Swamped; Bellefonte Names Borough Officers

Tuesday was a field day for folks who've always wanted to get their names on a ballot but who didn't want to go the whole way in becoming a candidate.

Because both Democratic and Republican ballots carried but few candidates for local offices, voters supplied the lack of candidates with innumerable names, many of which received only one vote, but all of which had to be tabulated with as great care as though the entire election depended upon the tabulation.

In most districts this uncontrolled writing-in of names for local offices resulted in a large amount of extra work by the election boards. But in the case of the West Precinct of Boggs township, (Central City and its surrounding area) the thing went a bit too far. About 11 o'clock yesterday morning the Commissioners received a telephone call from the board. NINE PIERSON ACT PROJECTS PROVIDE WORK FOR 118

According to figures released this week by the Department of Public Assistance, 9 Centre county projects have been approved under the Pierson work-or-starve act. For these projects 118 full-time jobs have been requisitioned.

Centre county is well in the fore among countles of comparable size in getting Pierson Act projects under way.
