

Last fall the comparative figures were: Republican, 12,660, and Democratic, 11,374, the majority for the first-named party being 1286. This year's Republican majority is 2585. The relative strength last fall of the parties is again illustrated by percentages, with the Republicans at that time having 52.57 per cent of the registration and the Democrats having 47.33 per cent.

Democratic leaders yesterday pointed out that the drop of 2.56 per cent in Democratic registrations may safely be attributed to the fact that a certain number of voters like to be registered on the side of the party in power.
