The guest speaker, the Rev. Squire B. Schofield was born in Stratford-on-Avon, England, coming to the United States in 1911. Mr. Schofield was educated in England and also took additional work here in this country. He attended the University of Rochester and The Chicago University Extension School, specializing in social welfare work.

He has served many prominent parishes in the Diocese of Western New York. For 10 years he was Superintendent of the City Missions of the Episcopal church in Rochester, N. Y., which were followed by ten years of Rectorship at St. James' church, Muncy.

Since coming to the United States he has given the Memorial address for the G. A. R. in Livingston county, N. Y. of the New York Dragons for 27 years, an unbroken record.

From 1917 to 1929 Mr. Schofield worked with the late Bishop Charles H. Brent, Chaplain General of the A. E. F. in France during the late World War.

He is a member of the F. A. M., R. A. M. Council Monroe Commandery, and the Scottish Rites of Rochester, New York. Mr. Schofield is also a member of the Social Relations Commission of the Province of Washington, a position which he has held for the last ten years and to which he was re-elected at the Commission's convention held in Wilkes-Barre two weeks ago—the term of office lasting three years.

(Continued from page one) leaving the building only when the heat became unbearable. Mr. Baer and the younger son were rushed to the hospital. Both were badly burned over their entire bodies. Mrs. Baer suffered slight burns about one hand and arm while the son, Charles, escaped injury.

The house, with all its contents, was burned to the ground, Millheim firemen being unable to extinguish the blaze because of lack of water. The property was owned by Mr. Baer who had purchased it some time ago.

Willard Elmer Baer, Sr., was a son of Albert and Minnie Fisher Baer and was born in Baltimore, Md., on February 6, 1901, making his age at time of death 38 years, 8 months and 23 days. On July 5, 1934, he was united in marriage with Carrie Vonada, who survives with one son, Charles A., aged 7 years. Surviving brothers and sisters are: Charles A., Roy, Jesse, Earl, Edgar, Vernon and Mrs. Clara Karas.

Willard E. Baer, Jr., son of Willard E. and Carrie Vonada Baer, was born in Gregg township on March 17, 1936, making his age at time of death 1 year, 7 months and 12 days. Survivors are his mother and brother, Charles A.

Double funeral services for father and son were held on Tuesday afternoon at the George's Valley church, with interment in the church cemetery.
