McDonald, of Martha, passed away at her home there at 2:55 o'clock Monday afternoon after an illness which had its inception in a stroke she suffered some time ago. JOHN WESLEY CARTWRIGHT

John Wesley Cartwright, retired veteran Pennsylvania Railroad employe and member of Milesburg Borough Council, died at his home in Milesburg at 11:45 o'clock Tuesday morning after an illness with a complication of diseases. Mr. Cartwright had been in failing health for several years and had been bedfast for the last four weeks. The deceased, who for 52 years was in the continuous employ of the Pennsylvania Railroad in the maintenance of way department of the Tyrone Division, was retired in May, 1931. He was an honorary member of the Milesburg Fire Company, and had lived until December 13, he and Mrs. Cartwright would have observed their 40th wedding anniversary. Mr. Cartwright was a son of Jacob and Sarah Bennett Cartwright and was a native of Curtin, having been born in that community on November 14, 1865, making his age at time of death 74 years and 21 days. Funeral services for the late Thomas Vaughn were held Monday afternoon at the family home in Sandy Ridge, in charge of Rev. J. P. McCurdy and Merle Cowher, with burial in Umbria cemetery, Osceola Mills. Thomas Vaughn was born in Bald Eagle on April 18, 1845, making him in his ninety-fifth year. His parents, George and Kathryn Vaughn, were old settlers of the Bald Eagle region. On March 20, 1889, he and Ann L. Pool, who died ten years ago, were united in marriage, the ceremony taking place in Tyrone by Samuel Jones, justice of the peace. To this union the following children survive: Mrs. Arta Orr and Mrs. Ada Kerr, of Akron, Ohio; Mrs. Gertrude Woodie, of Indiana; Grayson, Earl, Paul, Mrs. Almida Moore and Mrs. Lily Reese, of Sandy Ridge, and Miss Mary and William, at home. Three children preceded him in death: Mrs. Myra Steel, of Port Matilda, and George and Clyde, at home. There are twenty-seven grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren surviving. Mr. Belle Stuller and Mrs. Sally Stonebraker, sisters of Philadelphia, were also survivors. The death of Mr. Vaughn occurred Saturday morning at 7:15 o'clock, following a week's illness of heart trouble, superinduced by a complication of illness. Forty-seven years ago Mr. Vaughn left Bald Eagle and located at Sandy Ridge. He worked as a teamster until several years ago when he retired from active work. let struck him, and walked toward Bressler and his hunting companions, Lewis Baker, Walter Bressler, and George Armstrong. They helped Bressler to a car, and rushed him to a hospital. Bressler told his story voluntarily to hospital attendants and later repeated his statement to police.

Sampsel, who is unmarried and lives with his parents at Zion, was hunting with Max Sampsel and Mahlon Eoy. Both hunting parties were in the woods on the ridge north of Zion at the time, police said.

The wounded hunter was admitted to the hospital about 6:30 o'clock and examination revealed that the bullet had apparently struck him in the back and passed entirely through his chest. Yesterday

morning a group of ten Zion youths, including three of the injured man's brothers, reported to the hospital for blood tests preparatory to the process of transfusion. After the transfusion Sampsel is said to have shown definite improvement. Motor police yesterday said that no charges had been filed against Bressler. In view of the difficulty usually experienced by officers in securing accurate information about hunting accidents, Bressler's action in rendering every assistance to his victim, and in reporting fully and voluntarily to officers is most commendable.
