FLORENCE MAE EVES

Florence Mae Eves, of Warrior's Mark, R. D. 1, died at the State Hospital, Philadelphia, last Thursday following several months' illness with a complication of diseases. She was a daughter of David and Maggie (Reese) Eves, and was born in Centre county on March 9, 1890. She was a lifelong resident of Warrior's Mark valley. Surviving are two brothers and four sisters: Albert Eves and H. B. Eves, both of Warrior's Mark; Mrs. Frank Lykens, of Tyrone; Mrs. Ed. Gumbo, Mrs. George Laird and Mrs. Chilla Laird, of Port Matilda. She was a member of the Black Oak United Brethren church.

BENNER W. WOODRING

Benner W. Woodring, former hotel proprietor in Tyrone, died Saturday evening at 11:50 o'clock following an extended illness. Born July 25, 1882, in Centre county, he was the son of Franklin and Phemie (Cowher) Woodring. He was twice married. Members of the family include his second wife, Mrs. Jean Woodring; three children to the first marriage: Mrs. James Hartsock, of Altoona; Mrs. Arthur McGuire, of Williamsport, and Benner W. Woodring, Jr., of Lewistown; three brothers and sisters, Clark Hubert and Robert Woodring, Mrs. Clarence Galbraith and Mrs. Harry Uplik, all of Tyrone. Mr. Woodring was of the Presbyterian faith and a member of Altoona lodge of Elks.

FRED MOYER THOMPSON.

Fred Moyer Thompson, one of Bellefonte's best known colored residents, passed away at the family home at 12 North Penn Street, at 8 o'clock Saturday night after a year's illness with cerebral palsy. Mr. Thompson became ill last January shortly after he accepted an appointment as Justice of the Peace in the Senate Chamber at Harrisburg. His condition did not improve and in May he was forced to return to Bellefonte. Since then he had failed steadily, although several weeks ago he was able to walk down town. Mr. Thompson was a son of James and Annie Thompson and was born in Bellefonte on August 9, 1876, making his age at time of death 63 years, 4 months and 7 days. He is survived by his aged mother, with whom he made his home, and the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Charles Stewart, of Atlantic City; Miss Mary Elizabeth Thompson, and Warner Thompson, both of Harrisburg; Albert Thompson, of Philadelphia; and Edward S. Thompson, of Bellefonte. The deceased was a lifelong resident of Bellefonte with the exception of the time he spent as an employe of the State government at Harrisburg at various times during the past 15 years. He was always an active member of the Republican party. Funeral services were held yesterday afternoon at the home, with the Rev. Evan Brown, pastor of St. Paul's A. M. E. Church, officiating. Interment was made in the Union cemetery, Bellefonte.

Simon Peter Staub, of Juniata, died Wednesday evening at the family home following a brief illness. Born January 17, 1875, in Mapleton, he was a son of John and Eliza (Auld) Staub. Game protectors yesterday warned all hunters that they are required by the State Game laws to file reports of game killed during the 1939 season. This ruling applies to large and small game, officials emphasized.

Local game protectors now have on hand a long list of hunters who failed to turn in game reports for the 1938 season and have been instructed to levy fines in these cases.

Game reports for the season just ended should be mailed without delay to the Pennsylvania Game Commission, Harrisburg, Pa. Remember, if you had a 1939 hunting license, you must send in a game report, whether or not you were successful in your hunt.
