THOMAS ADAM ZELENICK

Thomas Adam Zelenick, 11-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. John Zelenick, of Bellefonte, Pa., died at 4:30 o'clock Tuesday morning at the Centre County Hospital. The child was born at that institution on December 21. Survivors include the parents and two children, Thomas and David. Funeral services and interment were held at St. John's Catholic cemetery, Bellefonte, yesterday morning.

WILLIAM T. SPOTTS

William T. Spotts, of East Beaver avenue, State College, died at his home at 2:30 o'clock Sunday night of heart trouble following a two years' illness. He was 69 years, 6 months and 9 days old at the time of his death. Born June 22, 1871, at Martha Furnace, he was a son of Jacob and Isabel Cronister Spotts. His wife, the former Elizabeth Wise, survives with the following children: Mrs. Charles Kern, of State College; E. I. Spotts, of Boalsburg; and Mrs. Harrison Wanner, of Williamsport. Mr. Spotts was a member of the Pine Hill Lutheran church and was affiliated with the Modern Woodmen of America. Funeral services were held yesterday afternoon in the Koch Funeral Home, South Burrows street, State College, with Rev. J. N. Fisher officiating. Interment was made in the Pine Hill cemetery.

CALVIN JONES

Calvin Jones, who for many years maintained a wall paper business in Philipsburg, died suddenly Sunday evening at the dinner table at his home at that place, following an illness of 10 days from which he was apparently recovering. He was a son of the late Edie and Henrietta Conrad Jones, of Port Matilda. He was born there on November 19. He was married in Philipsburg in 1896 to Anna Lucas, who survives him. One son, Burton K., of Philadelphia, also survives him, as do the following brother and sister: Mrs. Emory McAfee, of Stormstown, and George T. of Pittsburgh. Mr. Jones was a member of the First Presbyterian church and was formerly an active member of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks which he served twice as Exalted Ruler and several times as secretary. Mr. Jones was a member of the Republican party and served several times on the town council. He was the president of council during the Old Home Week celebration. He served a number of years as assessor of the first ward. A few years ago he was a candidate for burgess. Funeral services, in charge

of his pastor, the Rev. Charles W. MacLay, were held Wednesday afternoon from the home. Interment was made in the Philipsburg cemetery.
