

THE WAR IN EUROPE

There is every reason to believe that the British and French, encouraged by the successful fighting of the Finns, are taking steps to supply the Finns with material assistance.

The surprising defeats of the Russian invaders in Central and Northern Finland some weeks ago indicated to military observers that the fighting machine everybody thought would crush the Finns, can extend enough help to Finland to enable that republic to stop Russian aggression, the results may be tremendous.

Germany's pact with Russia becomes less dangerous in proportion to the weakness of the Red Army. If the Soviet Army is no better than the fighting in Finland indicates, there is little prospect that Germany will receive military assistance from Russia regardless of the course of the war. Moreover, the pressure on the Balkan area is relieved and it is barely possible that Japan, facing new difficulties in China, might turn her attention north of Manchukuo.

"Have-Nots" and Aggression

In attempting to understand the course of the present struggle, it is important to remember at all times the fundamental cleavage between the nations of Europe, where Germany and Italy, as the "have-not" nations, seek to upset the status quo. While at present, Italy is on the sidelines, there is always the prospect that a spectacular German success might entice Mussolini into the fray.

In fact, repercussions of the European situation are even discernible in the Far East where Japan takes advantage of the unsettled world conditions to advance her aims at the expense of China and the Western powers. Fundamentally, these three nations will benefit from aggression and the activity of either makes more possible the success of the others. German aggression against the small neutral states and the Soviet attack upon Finland, it seems to us, represent an opportunistic advance rather than a deliberately planned effort to conquer.

War in Slow Motion

The warfare between Germany and the Allies continues in slow motion, presenting one of the strangest spectacles in the military history of the world. With millions of men under arms, neither side dares to attack the fortified line of the other, with the result that there is a complete stalemate. There is little reason to believe that the Allies contemplate any major offensive activity on the Western Front but it is easily possible that Germany will seek to break the deadlock before the fighting strength of the Allies is fully developed.

It should be remembered that the Allied campaign, for the present, depends almost entirely upon the economic strangulation of Germany through a rigorous blockade which the British fleet is enforcing in the North Sea. It is virtually impossible to ascertain the effects of the blockade upon Germany, but, at least, it can be assumed that the stoppage of commerce and supplies is going Hitler and his regime no good.

Plans Versus Blockade

The German answer to the blockade has been a determined drive by submarines and airplanes to interfere with the operation of surface ships. This point attack has succeeded in inflicting heavy losses upon the British, as well as neutral nations, but unless it becomes more intense, there is little prospect that the British Navy will relinquish its vital control of the sea lanes. From the air, German planes have successfully attacked a number of small vessels along the British coast. News dispatches, telling of such exploits, give no inkling of the use of great numbers of bombing planes. The claims that emanate from Berlin tell of the sinking of ships but the test of the campaign, it seems to us, is whether Germany launches an aerial offensive in tremendous strength. So far, there is no indication of the use of huge air forces in the offensive against shipping. If preliminary attacks had yielded satisfactory results, it would be logical for the German high command to throw its full aerial strength into similar attacks. The fact that this is not being done seems to cast some doubt upon the effectiveness of these raids.

HOUSEHOLD SCRAPBOOK

Floor Crack Filler. An effective filling for open cracks in floors may be made by thoroughly soaking newspapers in paste made of one pound of flour, three quarts of water, and one tablespoonful of alum, thoroughly boiled and mixed. Make the final mixture about as thick as putty, and it will harden like paper mache.

Butter Purity.

Should one wish to test the purity of butter, put a little in a spoon and hold over the gas flame. If it dissolves without sputtering, it is pure. However, if it contains some other substance, it will sputter.

Cellar Steps.

If the cellar steps are dark, paint the bottom one white; it might save a bad fall.

Smashed Finger.

If one should smash the fingertip badly, hold the hand up for at least an hour so that the blood drains out of the finger. This will prevent the blood from congesting at the smashed place and causing an ugly discoloration of the nail.

Cleaning Diamond Ring.
