cause of the failure of the old fire siren stop the county jail building, found the blaze out of control when they arrived at the school. Calls for aid brought equipment and firemen from State College, Milesburg and Pleasant Gap. As many as 17 streams of water, under high pressure, were directed on the building at the height of the blaze. The building, entirely gutted within a few hours after the discovery of the fire, later was examined by architects and the walls were condemned as being unfit for further use. The school board later awarded the contract for the demolition of the walls and foundations to Edward Koltman, of Bellefonte. Two weeks to the day from the date of the fire, all classes were resumed in the Bellefonte Academy building, which had stood idle for several years and which was hastily equipped and made ready for occupancy. The school district pays \$400 monthly for the rental of the building, and \$25 a month for the use of the equipment that was in it. The fire seemed to have begun a long series of misfortunes to the Bellefonte school district. Plans which were under way for the construction of a wing to the old building, as well as for a large new wing which was to have been built under the Thompson plan, both came to nothing through the abolition of the FWA program and the failure of the Thompson plan to become a reality. Added to this, the district has learned that it is virtually impossible to obtain state or federal financial aid for a new building. The district collected approximately \$100,000 in insurance from the fire and this fund, together with a \$500 bond for the building purposes approved by the citizens of Bellefonte, is the only money available for a new building. The district has borrowed up to within about \$5,000 of its legal limit. That margin has been reserved for short-time loans in case of any emergencies. In less than a week after the school fire, Bellefonte sustained other heavy fire losses when the Lyons building on South Allegheny street was badly damaged, and
