May Establish Fire Bureau

er in for a conference, at which time his duties will be fully explained to him.

Two members of Council reported having received newspaper clippings pointing to the need for an adequate and regular inspection of fire hazards in the borough.

Councilman Cowter suggested the organization of a fire bureau, which George Carpeneto reported could be established through the passage by Council of an ordinance. The ordinance would give the fire department the right to inspect buildings and make suggestions for removing or correcting fire hazards. Carpeneto said that one recent major fire in Bellefonte would not have occurred if the borough would have had a fire bureau. Firemen, he said, had warned the owner of the property to correct a fire hazard, but the department had no power to enforce its ruling and the correction was not made. The fire loss came as a result, he said. No action was taken in the matter.

Bids for new equipment asked by the Logan Fire Company were awarded, the total cost of the equipment being \$817, or \$82 less than the next lowest bidder.

Councilman H. E. Mauck, of the Town Improvement Committee, reported that trees will be planted at the rear of the Dunlap Motor Co. garage on West High street if Council furnishes fence posts and connecting cable or chain. Since the borough has some cable on hand, it is believed Council will furnish the fence.

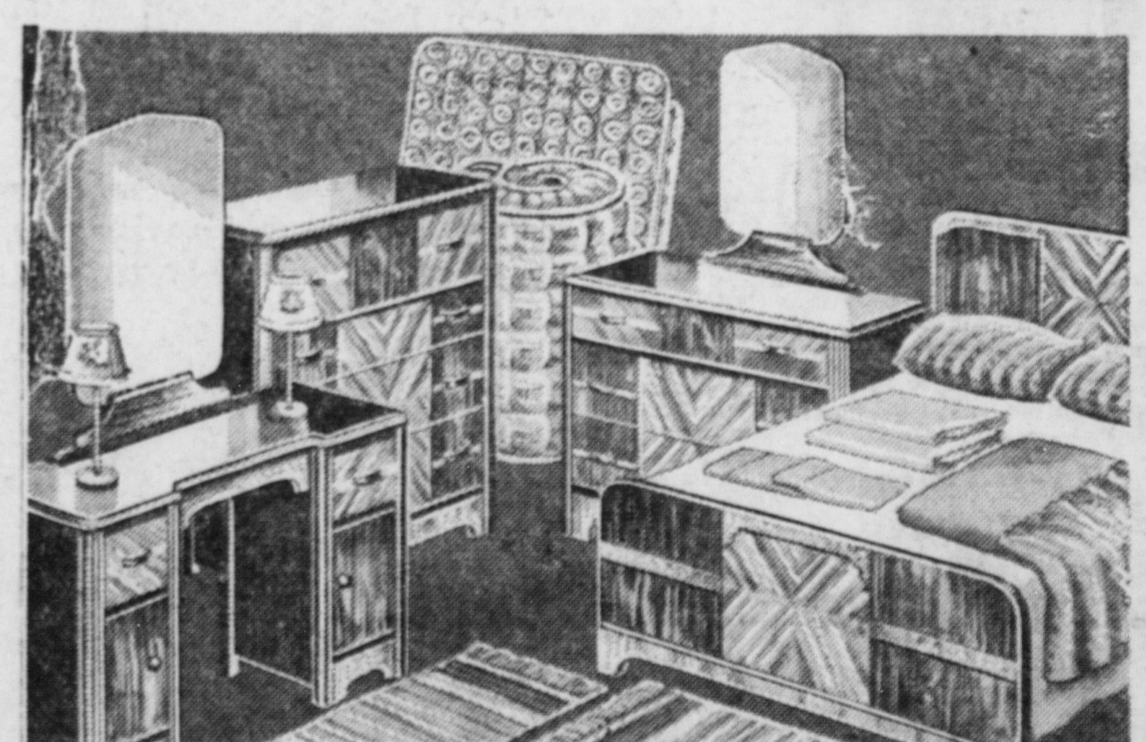

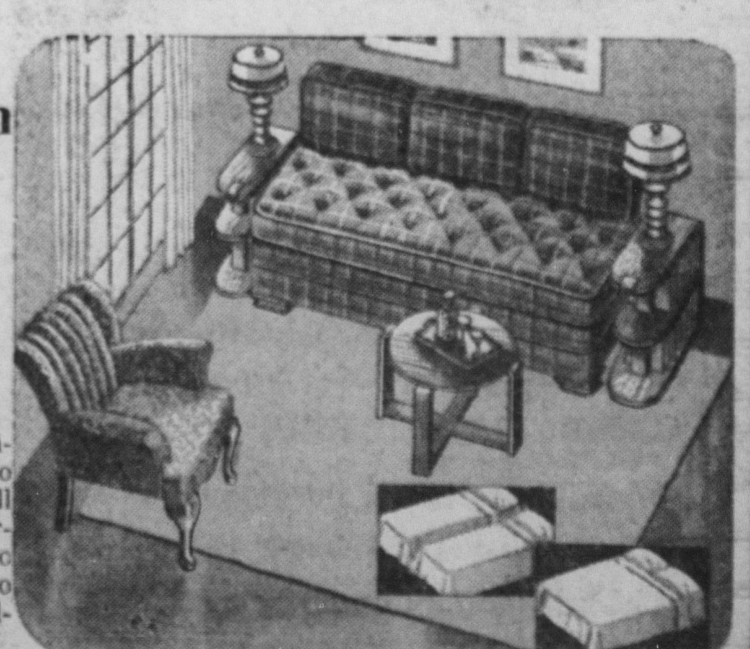
