OF MEDICAL SCIENCE

1. Dr. Walter Reed: Born in Belroi, Va., 1851. Educated at Virginia University, Bellevue and Johns Hopkins. First Lieutenant, U.S. Army Medical Corps. Noted for research, study and writings on Typhoid and Yellow Fever. Said to have made possible building of Panama Canal by making possible yellow fever control. Died 1992.

2. Dr. Robert Koch: Born in Hanover, Germany, 1843. Educated University of Gottingen. First to discover bacillus of Tuberculosis. He and his laboratory associate also discovered within a period of twelve years causes of cholera, tetanus, glanders, pneumonia, meningitis and plague. A great scientist and teacher in the medical field. Died 1918.

3 Lord Joseph Lister: Born in London, 1827. Educated University College in London, surgeon at Royal Infirmary of Edinburg, professor surgery Glasgow University, professor surgery King's College, London. First to use aseptic measures in surgery. Used first drain tube on Queen Victoria in 1871. Established Lister Institute of Preventive Medicine. Revered as having made the world safe for surgery and child birth. Died 1912.

4. Wilhelm Konrad Roentgen: Born Lennep, Germany, 1845. Educated Polytechnic School, Zurich, Switzerland: received degree engineering, 1868; Ph. D., 1869; professor mathematica and physics, Wurtemberg, 1875; Glessen, 1879, Wurzburg, 1888. Here in 1895 he gave to the scientific world his great discovery of X-rays. Died 1923.
