TWO DIE IN CRASH ON HIGHWAY AS CAR STRIKES GUARD RAIL

Fatal Accident Occurs on Clearfield-Philipsburg Road Last Wednesday Night; Driver Held for Court

Death chalked up two more highway victims last Wednesday evening when the car driven by Ralph S. Jones, Osceola Mills, struck a guard rail near Pleasant Hill, on the Philipsburg-Clearfield road, and killed two companions, Lemuel Myers, Osceola Mills, and Sam Lombardo, of Woodland.

Jones was taken to jail at the request of the Clearfield county coroner and later released under \$500 bail, pending a hearing on a charge of involuntary manslaughter.
