Keeping the peace is not a cinch as Norwegians will testify

Farmers in Centre county interested in securing wider markets for their products, may be interested to learn that the growers of California Valencia oranges will spend \$1,000,000 advertising their Sunkist product this year. An advertising assessment of seven cents a box has been levied by the growers exchange to pay for the campaign to push the sale, not of oranges, but of Sunkist oranges. We are not familiar with all the details that surround the co-operation of the orange growers of California but there is a lesson to be learned from their success in salesmanship in former years. The lesson, it seems, is "advertising pays."

Out of the Pardon Board's recent grist comes another reason why in so many instances to ican people are loath to abolish capital punishment. In this instance, the record shows a man was sentenced to die seventeen years ago. Instead of death his sentence was commuted to life imprisonment. Today he is free on the plea that he will leave the country. So again it appears as though imprisonment for life really isn't life imprisonment at all.

Knowing this, the people in most instances refuse to substitute life imprisonment for death in the law. When life imprisonment is just that, capital punishment may become obsolete.

Norway and Sweden stood by while Finland got a beating; Sweden stands by while Norway and Denmark are invaded; pretty soon there will be no neutral nations to stand by while another neutral takes a whipping.

The acquittal in the Dauphin county court last week of Democratic State Chairman Lawrence and seven other prominent Pennsylvania Democrats, charged with conspiracy to force political contribu-tions from State employes, will be accepted generally as a righteous verdict. There can be no illusion to "whitewash" as the jury was composed of twelve Republicans. That jury to all indications were convinced that whatever methods might have been used in soliciting contributions, there was no evidence of conspiracy. And besides, every juror had knowledge that his or her own party had employed somewhat similar methods of raising campaign funds long before the Democrats got their first chance to put Democratic workers on the payroll The whole affair seemed to have been born of spitework and will prove nothing more than a costly experience for Dauphin county taxpayers who must pay the expense.

The fact that the Allies are restricting their purchases in this country may need some explanation. As everyone knows, the United States requires that nations at war pay cash for any goods bought in this country. The nation advises belligerents that they will not be given credit in this country, if they are already in debt to us, as the British and French happen to be. Faced with this situation, the Allies, with limited gold supplies, naturally take steps to be assured of the funds with which to pay for war supplies, the most vital necessity of any nation at war Consequently, the British and French limit their buying in the United States to goods absolutely necessary for the prosecution of the war. The Allies limit their purchases of non-essentials in order to conserve their cash for what they must have if they are to win. This is a sensible policy, from the Allied standpoint. It is a policy that is necessary in view of the requirements set up by the United States.

Whether we realize it or not, it is true nevertheless that this would be a very dead community were it not for the WPA. When we speak of certain people working on WPA or living off of it, the inference is that they and they alone are the only ones benefited. Get away from such ideas. All of us, to a greater or less degree are living off the WPA. This has been clearly illustrated during the weeks when WPA was practically at a standstill in the county, and one every turn was the cry of poor business, and unpaid bills. Without WPA many store rooms would have the "For Rent" signs displayed. We wish there was some way whereby WPA would not be necessary, and there may be, but we don't know what-neither do those who so severely and unjustly condemn it. Many of those who cry it down, are being built up financially because of it. If the merchant, professional or business man feels that the WPA does not benefit him, let him put out this sign, "No WPA money accepted" and see how long he would continue in
