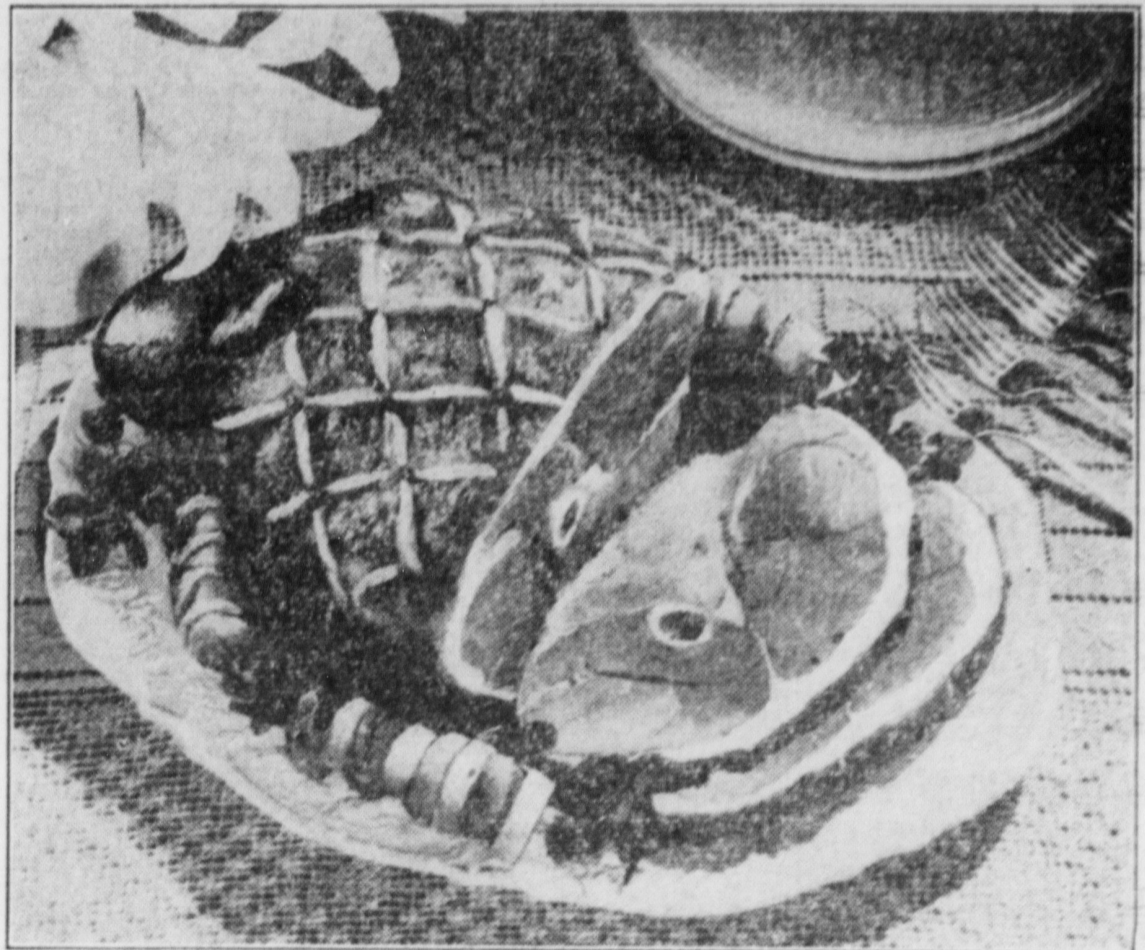

Place ham on a rack in an open roasting pan with the fat side up. Turn oven switch on with control set at 300°. The ham may be placed in a cold oven or oven may be preheated to 300°. It will take about 2 minutes more per pound for the cold oven start. About 5 minutes more per pound should be allowed if the ham is taken directly from the refrigerator. Allow twenty to twenty-five minutes per pound for baking.

Then there is the roast. Let us say you have chosen a whole ham—baked ham is really a roast, you know—and it will bake in your modern electric range while you are at church or entertaining your guests. You need never give it a thought.

Baked Ham. Place ham on a rack in an open roasting pan with the fat side up. Turn oven switch on with control set at 300°. The ham may be placed in a cold oven or oven may be preheated to 300°. It will take about 2 minutes more per pound for the cold oven start. About 5 minutes more per pound should be allowed if the ham is taken directly from the refrigerator.
