Change Personnel At Postoffice

Everett's Transfer to Rural Route Causes General Move-up in Staff

Because A. R. Everett, since August 19, 1915 a city carrier out of the Bellefonte postoffice, is to become carrier on rural route No. 2, effective May 6, a number of changes in the personnel at the local postoffice are expected to take place. Postmaster George R. Meek announced yesterday.

Mr. Everett has been trying to secure a transfer to a rural route for the past five years, and yesterday's announcement is the fulfillment of his wish. Bellefonte rural route No. 2 was left without a regular carrier recently when Cecil Fletcher was transferred to the Howard rural routes. Since then J. Henry Garbrick, a substitute in the Bellefonte office, has been taking charge of the local rural route.

With Mr. Everett's departure from the city carrier service, a general move-up of the personnel is in order. Mr. Meek declared, Russell Rider, parcel post carrier, will probably become carrier on city route No. 3 to replace Mr. Everett.

Andrew Saylor, present substitute carrier, will become parcel post carrier to succeed Mr. Rider. Saylor will be elevated to the status of a full time carrier through the change.

City route No. 5, which has been in charge of Mr. Saylor, will be supplied by Walter Gherity, who has had a substitute rating. Mr. Gherity will still retain his classification as a substitute, but because of additional duties his earnings will be practically doubled.

With Mr. Gherity's transfer into near full-time active substitute work, the only actual substitute in the Bellefonte postoffice force will be Frazer W. Schlegel.

Reforesting County Lands

This spring owners of private land in the Sprout Forest District, which comprises the northern part of Centre County and the western part of Clinton County, are planting 22,000 forest tree seedlings furnished from Department of Forests and Waters nurseries. Red Pine, White Pine, Pitch Pine, Japanese Larch, White Spruce, Norway Spruce, and Red Oak comprise the principal species. At the same time 70,500 seedlings are being planted in the Sprout State forest. About one thousand seedlings are required to reforest one acre, and should produce about twenty thousand board feet of timber.
